BRIEF HISTORY

Fatima Jinnah Women University (FJWU) has been established in the premises of The Old Presidency, situated at The Mall, in the heart of Rawalpindi Cantonment.

Our heritage has been beautifully interlinked with the education of women. The main building is Victorian, as reflected in its architectural splendor. This building was originally built as a residence by two famous Sikh brothers, Mohan Singh and Sohan Singh. It became the Presidency of Pakistan around the mid-1960s. The rooms are steeped in history: personalities like Ms. Benazir Bhutto, Mr. Chaudhry Fazal Elahi and President Zia-ul-Haq have walked the corridors of this building. Former Prime Minister Mian Muhammad Nawaz Sharif inaugurated this gift for the nation's daughters and their families on August 6, 1998. It stands as a symbol of the commitment of the nation to women education. The university is unique in the fact that the Punjab Government funds it. The Government of Punjab is very supportive of the university, thereby, furthering the cause of women education and empowerment. Classes commenced at FJWU on December 28, 1998 and the first batch of students graduated in September 2001. Students have been coming from all over the country from as far as Balochistan, Southern Punjab, and Sindh. **To date, about 25,461 students have successfully graduated and awarded degrees by the University.** A large number is effectively employed in various organizations in and outside the country. Women working at the university have made history in diverse ways. The university offers courses that are compatible with international standards. Thus, it opens the doors of opportunities for women. Educational institutions from all over the world have been in touch with FJWU to develop Exchange Programs and collaborations.

RECREATION

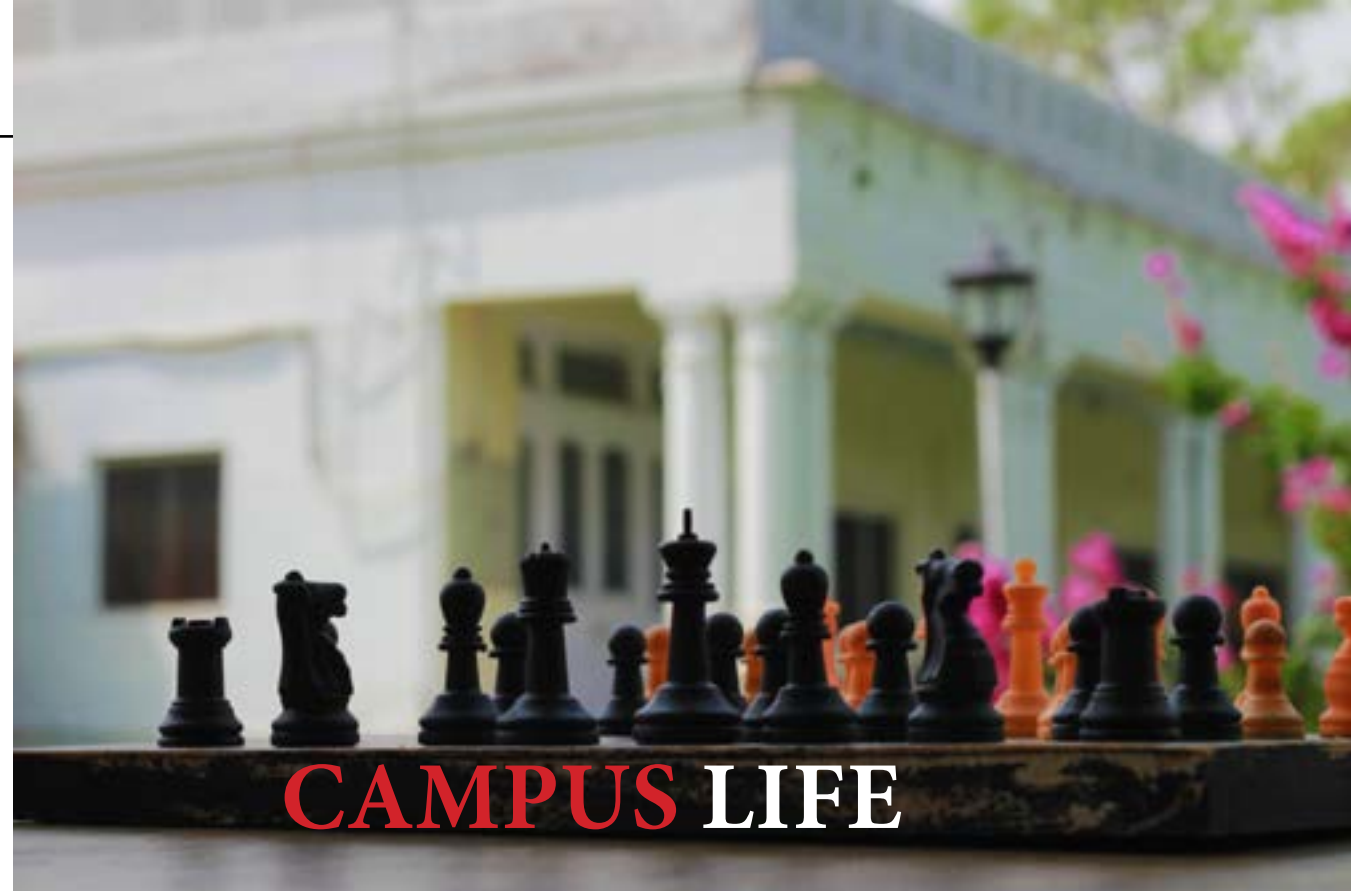

Fatima Jinnah Women University is committed to provide students and faculty/ staff, with the resources they need and to make those resources readily available for their use.

LIBRARY

Fatima Jinnah Women University Library, which houses a wealth of knowledge and information, came into existence in 1998 with the founding of the university. The library was initially located in the old Presidency, a building rich in heritage and architectural beauty. It remained in the old building up to 2006, after which it was shifted to the first floor of Academic Block II, to accommodate the library's growing collection. In 2020, a major part of the Library collection is shifted to the basement of the sports complex. In 2024, books of six departments have been shifted to Campus II at Chakri. The library has established its repute by providing excellent services and facilities to fulfill needs of its clients. The library is manned by qualified and experienced professionals, all dedicated to provide high quality innovative services.

Library Location

Main Library has two locations and one Education department library. Location I comprises of Computer Lab, Periodical section, Thesis section, and SBARR (Susan B. Anthony Reading Room). Second location at Sports Complex, contains the general books and reference books sections.

Circulation services are being provided in this location. Education books are placed in the departmental library of Department of Education.

Library of Campus II contains Reference books and general books on the subjects of Law, Biotechnology, Bioinformatics, Commerce, Physics and Electronic Engineering. Law reporting journals are also part of this library.

Library Collection

Library mission is to provide support to the academic and scholarly endeavor of users, in their core instructional and research requirements through utilizing the best possible resources, systems and services. The library has a rich collection of materials, including books, journals, magazines, videos, CD-ROMs, DVDs, etc. The FJWU library has more than 50,000 books. Thesis of M.Phil and Ph.D scholars of the University are also part of Library Collection. The collection is ideally suited to encourage and support both academic and research activities of the university. Library has subscribed the databases of HEC digital library. Fourteen daily Newspapers are also included in library collection. INTRODUCTION the users such as Pakistan Law site for the students of Law department. They can access books, journals theses and dissertations through this facility.

Library Services

FJWU provide Library Services

regarding Book Lending, Reference Service and Searching Assistance in both campus libraries.

• Book Lending:

All registered users are entitled to borrow books and other materials according to the FJWU Library Policy. Circulation Desk provide all the necessary information for transaction of Library collection.

• Reference Service:

An active help desk provides efficient and reliable service under the supervision of professional librarians. Users may query by telephone or E-mail at: librarian@fjwu.edu.pk.

• Searching Assistance:

Self-searching systems are available in Library for seeking the call numbers of required books.

• Inter-Library Co-operation:

Arrangements are also made for interlibrary loan for books and journals especially with libraries of Islamabad and Rawalpindi on the request of librarians. It is a co-operative effort on the part of the librarians and it is useful too, for the procurement of literature not available in the library, without which it is difficult to collect all such useful materials on an individual basis.

Digital Library Facility

FJWU is also proud to offer online access to HEC digital library. HEC digital library program began in Pakistan in January 2005, and currently provides a vast collection of online resources to the researchers of Public and Private sectors universities. Some online resources also have been subscribed. Students in the Law department can access books, journals, theses, and dissertations through the pakistan law site.

• SBARR (usan B. Anthony

Reading Room):

The Susan B. Anthony Reading Room is joint partnership program between FJWU and the Information Resource Center of the US Embassy Pakistan. It provides multimedia resources, English language materials, information about studying in the U.S., cultural activities, and lectures on topics of interests. Books, magazines, access to computers, internet and DVDs.

• United Nation Corner:

UN Corner is a Joint partnership program between FJWU and United Nations Information Centre. Student have direct access to the useful information on the projects of United Nations in Pakistan and at global level. As an innovative bookshelf, the UN Corner serves as a bridge in rapport development between Pakistan and the World.

• Library Computer Lab:

A number of computers are available in its lab for the use of students. All the systems are connected with the internet facility. Some of the important softwares are being installed in all the systems.

• Library Users:

Library Membership is opened to all enrolled students of FJWU and to permanent FJWU faculty and staff members. The users are entitled to borrow Books and other library materials from the library. Borrowing limit may be depending on the membership category.

Library Orientation and Information Literacy Sessions:

Library organizes orientation sessions for newly enrolled students of the University. In these informative sessions; basic information about membership and daily Library usage are provided to the students.

Information Literacy sessions are regularly held in library for the students and faculty members. The topics

included the HEC Digital Library, literature review, Citations software etc.

Sessions of Library Book Club and Human Library are also arranged by the Library on monthly/quarterly basis. Students from different departments of the university participated in book clubs and improve their reading habits.

RADIO VOW FM 96.6 FATIMA JINNAH WOMEN UNIVERSITY CAMPUS

Radio VoW started its transmission on August 14, 2006 in collaboration with USAID. It is the project of Communication and Media Studies which is run and managed by a women university. Radio Station also acts as Community Radio addressing community issues and building awareness about them.

Radio VoW FM 96.6 MHz also provides hands-on training to media students. It trains them in various aspects of sound production, editing and anchoring.

Radio VoW broadcasts live transmission for five days a week from 11:00am to 2:00pm and repeat broadcast from 3:00pm to 6:00pm.

Radio Programs are produced and broadcast by the Student Assistants, Interns and Volunteer Students under the supervision of Ms. Roqia Khurshid (Assistant Producer Radio VoW). Radio VoW acknowledges national & international days like International Women's Day, International Literacy Day, International Book Reading Day and International Global Warming Day etc. It not only broadcasts special programs but also organizes Interdepartmental Competitions on Special Days i.e 12th Rabi ul Awal, Independence Day & Quaid Day to enrich skills of students. Radio VoW archives is the largest Voice Cell of the University.

FJWU Campus Radio has the following aims and objectives:

- To provide a platform to the students to build their communication skills and give them exposure to the working media environment.

PLACEMENT OFFICE

Placement Office at Fatima Jinnah Women University provides a link between the job market and University students. This office is committed to providing all possible assistance to its graduates in their efforts to find employment. It not only furnishes information about **job opportunities for students and alumni but also equips them with the prerequisites of the jobs through seminars on Career Counseling. Seminars, lectures and workshops** are arranged in order to orient students for jobs. Guests are also invited from different organizations to give an insight into the professional arena. Staff is available to respond to students' questions and concerns of all kinds. This may include advice on hiring procedures, helping with preparation of applications and resumes, and assisting with practice interviews. Advice is based upon up-to-date placement statistics and an informed view of educational and market trends; the aim is to ensure that our graduates have the information and skills necessary for an effective job search. Placement Office arranges internships for students in areas relevant to their departments. It coordinates with the organizations, monitors the internship programs and keeps all record of internship activities. Students are screened and their resumes are reviewed before they are sent for interviews. We organize blood donation camps, as well as free eye and sugar testing camps, to promote health awareness and early detection of potential health issues. Additionally, we conduct breast cancer awareness camps, raise awareness about Diabetes, hypertension, and heart diseases, and offer nutrition assessment and free BMI checks, accompanied by personalized diet plans. Furthermore, we engage in mental health initiatives such as companionship programs and drives, including clothing and food drives, to support individuals in need within the community.

BANK

First Women Bank has its branch at FJWU to facilitate the university administration, staff and students. Students deposit their dues in this branch. This facilitates the boarders as

well as the day scholars.

STUDENTS' ACCOMMODATION

At FJWU, we offer a comfortable and supportive residential facility for outstation students. Currently, over 900 students from across Pakistan reside in the fully furnished halls at our City Campus (Wings I, II, & III). These halls are designed to ensure a pleasant living experience with spacious amenities, including a large dining area, lush lawns, a prayer room, TV lounge, and expansive common study rooms. Additionally, we provide indoor sports facilities for recreational activities. Each hostel is managed by dedicated faculty and staff to ensure smooth operations. Dr. Shahla Tabassum, the Deputy Provost, oversees the management of the hostels alongside the hostel staff (In-charges and Assistants), addressing daily operations, resident concerns, and ensuring adherence to policies and procedures.

Hostel Facilities:

- **Mess Facility:** Meals are prepared by trained chefs and served in spacious mess halls. A self-service kitchen is also available for students who prefer to prepare their own meals
- **Common Area & Prayer Room:** Dedicated spaces for relaxation and spiritual activities are provided.
- **Hot and Cold Water:** Hot water is available through gas geysers, and cold water coolers are provided for drinking water, according to seasonal needs.
- **Medical Facility:** A 24/7 ambulance service is available to transport students to nearby hospitals in case of medical emergencies.
- **Secured Premises:** The hostel buildings Hostel Gym are secured

with controlled entry points and 24/7 security guards for the safety of all residents.

Eligibility & Application Process:

To be eligible for accommodation, a full-time student admitted to any department of FJWU may apply, provided she does not have any alternative accommodation in Rawalpindi/ Islamabad and is not employed or receiving a house rent subsidy in the area. Please note that hostel accommodation is a privilege, not a right, and is subject to availability. All applications must be submitted on the prescribed forms within the specified deadlines for consideration.

Key Information:

- **Hostel Dues:** All applications and payments are submitted through an online portal related to hostel accommodation.
- **Seat Retention:** An allocated seat must be occupied by the notified date. Failure to do so may result in losing the seat unless reallocation is requested, depending on seat availability.
- **Refund Policy:** If a student wishes to leave the hostel within the first week of admission or the start of classes, she is entitled to a full refund of the hostel dues. Additional details about refund policies are available on the "Cost of Residential Services" page
- **Disciplinary Actions:** The Hostel Advisory Committee reserves the right to cancel a student's hostel admission on disciplinary/ moral or other grounds. We are committed to providing a safe, wellmaintained, and nurturing living environment that fosters academic and personal growth.

FJWU CENTERS



1. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY CENTER

IT Center has 23 well-equipped, State-of-the-art Computer Labs and more than 1500 Computers have been networked. Computer Labs are equipped to meet specific program needs and they are constantly updated to meet the required software/hardware. Students are required to abide by a code of conduct when using the computers. The Center has a dedicated video conferencing facility and 155 Mbps of internet connectivity for use of students and staff. The Center has also installed 64 multimedia projectors in almost all classrooms of the University. The maintenance of electronics equipment, computers and multimedia equipment is carried out by our own technicians, and a sickbay has been established for this purpose. The Center collaborates with

the overall plan of education, sciences, technology-thrust and development of IT in the country. The IT Center provides a wide range of services and seamless access to electronic information which helps in producing specialists in the field. FJWU has launched a massive program primarily to train women in IT. Therefore, the acceptance of our students in the market has been stupendous. The Center, which remains open throughout the year, provides state-of-the-art telecommunication facility to the Staff and Students. FJWU has secured Wi-Fi Network consisting of 32 Indoor and 4 Outdoor Access Points, which have been integrated with the existing LAN in the University. This is facilitating all Staff and Students and faculty to use Internet connectivity through their wireless cards within the University premises.

A wide variety of licensed software is



held by the IT Center and installed in labs for use by all concerned. IT Center has started Biometric Attendance System for all Faculty and Staff, a move for paperless environment. For security purpose, IT Center has deployed fully equipped Security System for the University. This security system consists of CCTV Cameras and two Security Walkthrough Gates at the entrances of the University. Electronic Security Management Wing has been established by IT Department for 24/7 monitoring of CCTV Cameras. IT Center has launched a VPN Server that enables access to Digital Library from outside University to Faculty & Students. Users are able to access the Digital Library by establishing a VPN Connection to FJWU VPN-Server. IT Center also collaborates with Registrar's office for distributing Laptops to Students under Prime Minister and Chief Minister Laptop Scheme.

2. WOMEN RESEARCH AND RESOURCE CENTRE

The Women Resource Centre was established in 1999 to sensitize women on gender related issues and to focus upon the enhancement of education and employment opportunities for the students of Fatima Jinnah Women University in all disciplines. In 2000, the Centre was renamed Women Research and Resource Centre to emphasize research on gender and social issues as also to reflect the academic and professional development of women in general and within the context of our society in particular.

Functions of WRRRC

The Centre has four functions: **Research, Teaching, Training and Networking.**

(i) Research

Research is based on gender and social issues related to our own ethos and culture to make it relevant to our needs. Research is usually sponsored and reports/articles are published and presented for dissemination of results. Currently, WRRRC is working on the project titled Climate Action, Gender, Youth and Leadership: A Community Service Project of FJWW, in partnership with Rozan, funded by Norwegian Church Aid under the European Union Power to the Youth Project (2022- 2024). It is a community-based climate change adaptation intervention that involves youth from underprivileged communities. FJWU is working in four communities in the Rawalpindi-Islamabad region.

(ii) Teaching

Teaching of gender related courses is part of the portfolio of WRRRC. The Centre offers courses which are interdisciplinary in nature regarding various gender oriented development issues. WRRRC offers 3 CH 'Gender, Youth and Development' Course at Bachelor's level across the board to all undergrad students at FJWU. Successful completion of this course is mandatory for the degree. WRRRC also offers Post-Graduate Diploma in Higher Education and Management (HELM). In collaboration with the British Council, WRRRC conducts 'British Council Citizenship Education and Community Engagement Program-Active Citizen General Education Course', a 3 CHs course in September, 2016.

(iii) Training and sensitization workshops

The Centre is actively involved in organizing national and international level workshops. Training that is carried out is need based and is tailored according to the needs of

clients/sponsors and also for the faculty and staff of the university. In recent years, WRRRC has collaborated with Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU), Higher Education Commission (HEC), Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC), British Council, ROZAN and Mehargarh: A Center for Learning.

(iv) Eminent Lecture Series

WRRRC continues its endeavor to invite eminent speakers to address the students on gender-related issues. Every semester, a number of distinguished national and international scholars are invited to share their experiences with the students.

(v) Networking

3. SDGS RESEARCH AND SUPPORT CENTRE (SRRC)

SDGs Research and Support Centre (SRRC) is established at FJWU with the support of the World Bank & South Asia Economic Policy Network. The Centre is connected with South Asia Economic Policy Network, World Bank as a distinguished Partner. The mission of the Centre is to assist communities and policymakers in Pakistan for achieving sustainable development in all its dimensions- economic, social and environmental- by conducting insightful research that aids in translating SDGs into actionable policies and solutions. The Centre is led by Prof. Dr. Bushra Yasmin, Director SRRC. Faculty & student volunteers of the Department of Economics are actively engaged in organizing and executing Centre's activities. The advisory board of Centre includes some of the most prominent names in the discipline. Centre has organized various activities since its inception in 2022 including International Conference on Sustainable Development in Contemporary World, Webinar/ Seminar Series on Core SDGs, Annual SDGs Poster Competition, Working Paper Series, Bi-annual Workshops on Philosophy & Techniques of Quantitative Research, SRRC Annual Symposium, Fatima Jinnah Lecture, SDGs Research Showcase and SDGs Mid-review Report for the Planning Commission. 4. DAY CARE CENTER

FJWU Day Care Center is a full time facility provided to the children of FJWU faculty, staff and Students and is a smart solution for parents who have day jobs. Day Care have many advantages that both children and parents can enjoy.

The age limit of the DCC has been increased to three and a half years and after that they are eligible to be shifted to early childcare center. The DCC runs under full supervision of the university. The Day Care staff comprises of Incharge, Teacher Assistant, Head Caregiver and 12 fully trained caregivers. The DCC rooms are bifurcated according to the age group. At the time of admission in day care, application is forwarded through department to Incharge day care who takes administrative approval from authorities.



Day Care is fully equipped with heating and cooling systems, CCTV Cameras are installed for surveillance. Day care is much more than play time and nap time. There are basic educational benefits for old toddlers who are being prepared for enrollment in school. LEDs are installed in all the three rooms to entertain the children and they also learn from listening rhymes and stories.

5. EARLY CHILD CARE CENTER (ECCC)

The Early Child Care Center (ECCC) runs under full-supervision of the university. It is supervised by Dr. Farhana Khurshid. The Early Child Care Center (ECCC) facility is available to university faculty, administration and married students. The ECCC is for babies of age 3.5 years to 10 years old. The staff of ECCC comprised of one teacher and ten caregivers. ECCC take care of children as per their age and involve them in different activities for their mental and physical growth. These activities include paintings, formation of letters, crafting, indoor and outdoor



games, and gardening opportunities are also provided. ECCC also worked on motor skills of students, e.g., wall chalk activity for pencil gripping. The medical check-up of the children is also done regularly by the medical center doctor. After school children come to ECCC in afternoon and their care is taken accordingly.

6. COLLABORATION AND LINKAGES CENTER

In keeping with Higher Education Commission (HEC) directive, Collaboration and Linkages Center (CLC) has been established at FJWU to develop and enhance opportunities for attaining international standards in teaching and research. The basic aim of the CLC is to explore the research areas / programs and departments for the placement of its Ph.D. Scholars and explore the possibilities of split Ph.D. degrees and faculty research. The present project of CLC is to build functional and mutually beneficial relationship with local and international institutions.

8. COUNSELING AND WELLNESS CENTRE

Counseling and Wellness Centre at Fatima Jinnah Women University strives to foster a health, caring community which would be beneficial for physical, social and emotional wellbeing of individuals. The centre is involved in the psychological profiling, assessment, counseling and intervention for students, faculty, staff and general community. Series of webinars, seminars, counseling camps, mental health weeks and workshops are being conducted in collaboration with other universities and organizations. These activities help to address common mental health issues and enhance overall quality of life and wellbeing of community. Moreover, specific workshops are being conducted for stress and anxiety management mindfulness based techniques for mood disorders, pain management and other psychological issues associated with traumatic events such as COVID 19 pandemic and floods. The Counseling and Wellness Centre actively participates in relief efforts including flood donation drives, clothing distribution, and hunger relief initiatives. We offer comprehensive facilities for assessment and counseling services, catering to both the general population and clients referred by other mental health professionals. Our commitment extends beyond providing support to those in need, as we strive to create a nurturing environment where individuals can access the assistance and guidance required to enhance their overall well-being.



9. NATIONAL CENTRE FOR RESEARCH ON SUICIDE PREVENTION (NCRSP)

Country's first National Centre for Research on Suicide Prevention (NCRSP) is a recently established Centre at Fatima Jinnah Women University. The centre was inaugurated on World Suicide Prevention Day 2021 by Mr. Riaz Fatyana, MNA/Convener National Parliamentary Taskforce on SDGs. The Centre is functional in collaboration with Pakistan Institute of Living and Learning (PILL) along with Global Mental Health Research Group, University of Manchester (UK) as allied partners. The facility is located at ground floor of Sports Gymnasium of the University. NCRSP as a dynamic centre of research with a particular focus on suicide and self-harm prevention in Pakistan is meant for innovative approaches to meet societal challenges in mental health through participation and collaboration and with commitment to change. The Centre aims to provide research based information for generating evidence and utilizing research evidence for informed policy, preventing suicidal tendencies, offering treatment care models, and promoting the healthy responsible behaviors in the society. We strive to be a catalyst

for mental health research to ensure needed steps to improve mental ill health prevention and the provision of care in Pakistan.

Goals and Functions of NCRSP

- Examining and conducting research by monitoring risk factors and protective factors associated with suicide and self-harm in Pakistan
- Offering service delivery through translational research by applying research based interventions at a local, national and international level
- Reducing stigma and promoting positive and responsible behavior in society
- Offering capacity building in mental health promotion and prevention of suicide to institutions, community and health professionals at national and international level.
- Translating and disseminating research in order to inform and impact on policy and practice.

10. THE CENTER FOR ENVIRONMENTALLY SUSTAINABLE TRANSPORT AND CLIMATE CHANGE (CESTAC)

1. CESTaC - An Overview

Center for Environmentally Sustainable Transport and Climate Change (CESTaC) was established as an independent center housed at VC's Block at Fatima Jinnah Women University (FJWU) in 2015 through a Letter of Agreement (LOA) signed jointly by UNDP's PAKSTRAN project and Fatima Jinnah Women's University (FJWU) with technical assistance from the Faculty of Science & Technology (including Environmental Sciences) of FJWU. CESTaC, Fatima Jinnah Women University (FJWU) is serving as a climate change and environmentally sustainable transport think-tank. The center is providing advisory and technical support that is resulting in the formulation of policy papers, research proposals, concept notes, etc. on the environment, climate change, and transport-related topics. It is also organizing numerous capacity-building activities in collaboration with stakeholders/national & international donors.

CESTaC key objectives are:

- Carry out policy-oriented research in the field of environment, climate change, sustainable transport, etc., and disseminate knowledge to policymakers and other stakeholders.
- Coordinate with potential clients and donors to acquire service contracts, grants, funding, and research assignments to multiply research activities and also ensure the sustainability of CESTaC.
- Carry out training need assessments (TNAs), and provide professional training to the relevant partners and government departments for strengthening their R&D capacities.

Main Activities

- Collaborate with relevant organizations and organize capacity-building activities (seminars, workshops, training) on the environment, climate change, and sustainable transport-related topics for relevant stakeholders.
- Extend supervision/facilitate students of FJWU in the completion of their research projects on environment protection, environmental data, transport (including e-vehicles), and sustainable development-related topics.
- Launch and sustainability of the "CESTaC Internship Programme"
- Arrange boot camps/innovative ideas competition programs on environment protection, climate change, and environment-related data by engaging FJWU students.
- Engage students of FJWU for article writing in magazines, newspapers/ blogs, etc.
- Formulate/update general education courses on e-mobility, SDGs, environmental audit,

and other related topics.

Key Achievements

- Updated the General Education Course on "Sustainable Transport & Climate Change" with Electric Mobility modules.
- Prepared project concept note/proposal and submitted it to the relevant financial window (national and international) thus to mobilize resources.
- Launched the CESTaC internship program and engaged FJWU students in different activities at the center.
- Developed factsheets, brochures, and policy papers on the environment, climate change, and sustainable transport-related topics that will be disseminated to relevant stakeholders.
- Collaborated with International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) and organized the academic Launch of the climate change gender action plan (ccGAP) on 29th Dec 2022 at Fatima Jinnah Women University (FJWU), Rawalpindi. The honorable Chairman Higher Education Commission (HEC), the Respected Secretary Ministry of Water Resources, Esteemed Vice Chancellors of 05 women universities, and eminent experts from various walks of life joined the event and appreciated CESTaC's role in arranging a productive event.

11. CAREER COUNSELLING CENTRE

The Punjab Higher Education Commission has funded for establishment of Career Counselling Center at Fatima Jinnah Women University. The Vice Chancellor, Prof Dr. Samina Amin Qadir, inaugurated the Center on January 26, 2017. The purpose of CCC was to narrow the gap between academies and industry and generate employability and marketable skills in students.

The Punjab Higher Education Commission aims to establish the Career Counseling Centers (CCC) in public sector universities of the Punjab with a standardized criterion and clear role at institutional level. CCC

extends various training, workshops, short courses, seminars for student to have better sense of selection of profession and path and give them exposure to markets and corporate trends and provide necessary skills to increase their employability skills during their stay at universities. CCC provides comprehensive services designed to help FJWU undergraduates, graduates, and alumni with their job search along with enhancing their educational, professional and personal development.

Objectives

Following are the objectives for the establishment of Career Counselling Centers:

- To develop a career path based on skills and interests of students.
- To gather all the available educational as well as occupational information to aid in developing this path.
- To select appropriate academic programs and other opportunities that maximize future educational and career options.
- To prepare to find an internship or occupation after university by developing job-search and presentational skills.
- To establish networks with alumni, employers, organizations and other groups that offer potential professional opportunities.
- To utilize technology to enhance career development by making them aware of online job portals
- To enhance professional communication skills for students and young faculty.
- To find employment or a graduate opportunity that fits their goals.
- To prepare to manage their careers after the completion of university education.
- To arrange education as well as job fairs to create industry-academia linkages.
- To help to identify the factors influencing the career development and help to assess Students' interest, abilities and values.

ACADEMICS

The academic year at FJWU comprises two regular semesters and one summer semester

Bachelors Degree Program

A student at the Undergraduate level studying for her Bachelors degree shall complete 130 credit hours (inclusive of 6 credit hours thesis)

In addition to above, Community Work (20 contact hours) and Internship for 6-8 weeks shall be a compulsory component of all Bachelors degree programs and the minimum required CGPA shall be 2.0.

Students securing highest CGPA in their respective session may be eligible for special awards/medals.

Higher Degree Programs

Fatima Jinnah Women University offers MS/M.Phil/Ph.D. programs consistent with the Higher Education commission (HEC) criteria requirements. These Programs require full time student enrollment for course work.

Scheme of Studies

FJWU Board of Studies for respective disciplines recommends the Scheme of Studies for M. Phill. and Ph. D. program. The scheme is liable to be revised form time to time. The general layout is as follows:

a. M. Phil Semester I & Semester II

The candidates are offered different courses in the first two semesters. A student is required to successfully complete 24 credit hours course work during this period.

b. M. Phil. Semester III & Semester IV

After successful completion of first two semesters, synopsis of research thesis is required to be approved by the FJWU Board of Advanced Studies

and Research.

Semester III & IV are specified for research and 06 credit hours of research is mandatory for the award of the M. Phill. degree.

c. Ph.D. Course Load & Research

Ph.D. requires 18 hours of course work followed by a comprehensive examination. Then the Ph. D. synopsis is approved by FJWU Board of Advanced Studies and Research for Ph. D. thesis. FJWU follows the criteria prescribed by Higher Education Commission. The program is regularly revised, updated and advertised accordingly. FJWU ensures the quality of M. Phil. and Ph. D. programs through regular assessment, feedback and follow up by regulatory bodies of the university. Details of rules and regulations pertaining to M. Phil. / Ph. D. studies can be obtained from respective departments at the orientation session.

Registration

Students have to complete registration formalities before the commencement of each semester, as per schedule notified by the Registrar's Office. Any late registrations are subject to availability of seats in that course and liable to payment of fine. The plan of studies offered at FJWU reflects a holistic vision as per the recent educational reforms. However, this development essentially involves extended logistics specifically for managing General Education Courses where students are offered to opt for choices. The option, nonetheless is limited in the sense that there is no possibility of re-visiting the choice. Students are facilitated to add / drop courses during a semester as per rules and after completion of due formalities.

Attendance

A minimum of 75% attendance per course is mandatory to be able to take the final term paper/s.

Grading Criteria

Absolute Grading Criteria is followed at FJWU from the year 2015 onwards.

How to Calculate GPA

- Multiply the number of credit hours by the number of grade points to get the number of quality points for each course. Sum of Credit Hour column.
- Sum of Quality points in a semester. Divide the quality points by the credit hours to obtain the GPA in a semester.
- To calculate the Cumulative GPA, divide the number of total quality points earned by the total number of credit hours attempted.

The Evaluation System considers the following in and out-of-ordinary circumstances faced by students:

Grading system for New induction from Fall 2019 (16 years Degree)

- Minimum qualifying CGPA for Graduate & Undergraduate Level is 2.0
- If the GPA is below 1.7, the student will be dropped from university rolls.
- However, she can seek fresh enrollment only once during 16 years degree Program.
- Those student acquiring GPA between 1.7- 2.0 will be placed on probation and promoted with the condition to achieve GPA 2.0 and above in next semester.
- There shall be maximum two academic probations in 16 years degree program.
- Both the probations should not be granted /availed in first four semesters.
- A student who is on probation 2nd time in f irst four semesters shall be removed from rolls of university. However, she can seek fresh enrollment only once during 16 years degree program.

M.Phil. /Ph.D. Level

- Minimum qualifying CGPA for M.Phil. / Ph.D. Level is 2.50.
- Those students acquiring GPA between 1.75-2.50 will be placed on probation and promoted with the condition to achieve GPA 2.50 and above in next semester.
- A student with GPA below 1.75 in any semester shall be dropped from University rolls.

Repeating Courses

Securing at least a pass grade is a must in all courses included in the Credit hour requirement. Failed course/courses, if any, are therefore to be necessarily repeated. In order to help improve their CGPA:

- Student of 16 Years of Schooling Degrees is allowed to repeat a course in which she has obtained grade below "C" i.e. C.
- Student of MS/MPhil is allowed to repeat a course in which she has obtained grade "C".
- Student cannot be permitted repetition of course after the award of degree.

Dropping a Course

Students are also facilitated in cases where they wish to drop course/ courses during a semester. However, recommendation of the department head and as per schedule notified by the Registrar's Office is necessary. Moreover, timing of deciding to drop course/courses happens to have some implications for award of respective letter-grade on the final transcript.

CGPA required for the Completion of Degree

If a student secures less than 2.00/2.50 INTRODUCTION the succeeding merit lists of any department, transfer will take place only on request and within the stipulated time of the respective merit list. CGPA at the end of final

Semester, she is allowed to get re-admission in one or more courses, in which her Grade is below C, along with the forthcoming semester, provided that she is not debarred under the CGPA Improvement Regulation and time duration specified for the program.

Criteria for passing a Course

To pass a course, it is mandatory for a student to obtain at least 50% marks in Practical, Projects, Thesis, Assignments, Test and Theory Paper separately/aggregate.

Cancellation of Enrolment

If a student fails to attend any lecture during the first four weeks without any information, after the commencement of the semester as per announced schedule, her admission shall stand cancelled automatically without any notification.

Breach of Examination Rules

Students are expected to be familiar with the Examination Rules, a breach of any of which will render a student liable to disciplinary action, which may result in the student's expulsion from the University. FJWU Examination rules and regulations are given on our website.

Transfer

At the time of Admission, if the name of a candidate appears in the succeeding merit lists of any department, transfer will take place only on request and within the stipulated time of the respective merit list.

Migration

Migration / Transfer of credits from other universities (within the country and abroad) is possible as per university migration / transfer of credits rules. The facility entails a specific time frame, and a transfer fee for the consideration of the case. The decision of the case will be subject to the approval of the Admission Committee.

Equivalence Requirements

As per HEC directives, no admission shall be granted to the students who studies O Level / Equivalent Education from abroad and A Level from Pakistan but have not studied the subjects of Urdu, Pakistan Studies and Islamiyat.

Required Number of Enrollment for Commencement of Classes

If the enrollment in any Department in Bachelors/Masters Program is less than 10 students at the time of admissions then that Department will not commence classes for that session and the student enrolled in that Department would be transferred to other departments, provided that: They fulfill the eligibility criteria for that Department Seats are available in that Department A minimum enrolment of 5 students would be required in each department for running any M. Phil Program.

Degree Completion Time Period

- 8 years (including course work duration) for Ph.D. Program
- 4 years (8 Semesters) for Masters

and M. Phil. Degree Programs

- 6 years (12 Semesters) for Bachelors Degree Program
- (This Period will include the semester break period)

Fee Submission and Refund

All fresh candidates are required to pay their initial dues as per schedule notified in the respective merit list. Failing to do so shall render the seat cancelled. In case a fresh student has submitted her dues, but is not able to attend classes, she is eligible to a refund as per HEC Fee Refund policy. (Fee Refundable Policy at the end of Prospectus) Continuing students have to submit their fee as per notified schedule, otherwise late fee charges will be levied. For fee/ security refund and/or clearance, the student has to produce the original fee challan form. All fresh and continuing students are therefore, advised to keep their original fee challans safely.

Discipline Committee

The functions of the Discipline Committee are:

- To propose regulations to the Academic Council relating to the conduct of University students, maintenance of discipline and breach of discipline.

- To perform such other functions as may be prescribed.

BACHELORS PROGRAM IN ANTHROPOLOGY

Anthropology these days has become a rising discipline and is being taught at undergraduate and postgraduate levels at several universities across Pakistan. Anthropology is the study of human behavior and exploration of what it means to be human, ranging from the study of cultures and social relations to human biology and evolution to language to music art, architecture, and vestiges of human habitation. It considers some fascinating questions such as how people's behavior changes over time, how people move about the world why and how people from different parts of the world and dissimilar cultures are different and the same, how the human species has evolved over millions of years and how individual understand and operate successfully in distinct cultural settings.

Anthropology includes five broad fields Cultural Anthropology, Linguistics, Physical Anthropology, Archaeology, and Applied Anthropology.

Anthropology contributes to a general liberal arts education which helps students develop intellectually and personally, as well as professionally. Numerous studies indicate that a well-rounded education contributes to a person's success in any chosen career and because of its broad interdisciplinary nature, anthropology is especially suited to this purpose. in the context

of liberal arts education, anthropology, and anthropological research cultivate critical thinking skills. By being exposed to cultures and lifestyles of unfamiliar societies, students may adopt a more critical and analytical stance towards conditions in their society. Further, anthropology creates an expanding global awareness and an appreciation of cultures other than our own.

The mission of the anthropology program at Fatimah Jinnah Women University is to advance the understanding of human diversity (human past and contemporary human life) by employing specific theoretical and conceptual tools. These shared commitments are pursued through research and teaching drawing on a diverse array of humanistic and scientific approaches.

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES:

Anthropology provides excellent knowledge and skills required for students seeking employment with a bachelor's degree in a wide variety of employment settings. MPHIL PROGRAM IN ANTHROPOLOGY

The Department of Anthropology offers a program of Masters of Philosophy in Anthropology designed to provide a broad background in the field with a prime emphasis on sociocultural anthropology. It provides training both for students interested in academic career anthropology and for those who want to work as action researchers and professionals. The program in sociocultural anthropology offers opportunities to pursue a wide range of ethnographic and theoretical interests. major focus of research includes religion, politics, ethnicity, gender, problems of social change and development, and media and educational landscapes. A program of study includes training in anthropological theory and methods, issues and problems in cultural anthropology as well as topics that focus on the student's areas of particular interest. This widened and intensive study of diversified fields of anthropology is accepted to cater to the needs of not only aspiring anthropologists but also scholars from other fields wishing to expand their expertise through ethnographic lenses. Designed to inculcate anthropological sensibility in students, the program includes a thorough study of the subject's classical and contemporary texts as well as practicums and discussions on key questions of methodological relevance. Through these options, students apply the social anthropological theories and methods learned on the core module's particular substantive themes and topics.

This program of advanced and intensive study enables students to creatively grapple with questions ranging from the nature of human society and the role of culture in shaping dispositions and behavior of citizens and subjects in the contemporary world. The program aims to work with students to address issues critical to contemporary Pakistan, including, governance and development issues, public discourse, livelihood, terrorism and intolerance, institutional developments and accountability, identity crises and globalization to meet the demands and

concerns of our country to make it a better place to live. All M.Phil. students are required to undertake extensive fieldwork to write a dissertation to integrate anthropological perspectives originally.

Phil Programs in Economics at FJWU are one of the outstanding research degree programs that have successfully completed its

fourteen years after initiation. The Ph.D. and M.Phil. Programs are regularly updated in line with recent innovations and revisions conveyed by HEC from time to time. The Department is endowed with highly qualified professional faculty members with their academic qualifications from Harvard University, Australian National University, and the University of Sheffield. The Department of Economics is now offering MS Economics starting in Spring 2026. The three-semester program is designed in line with HEC



guidelines and covers key areas in economics through its comprehensive curriculum.

The Department has also initiated Bachelor's and Associate Degree in Economics & Finance in 2023. The curriculum is spread over eight semesters (4 years) and four semesters (2 years) of rich and dynamic courses both in comprehensive and subject-specific learning.

The Bachelor's Program has been designed as per HEC guidelines. The curriculum is spread over eight semesters (4 years) of rich and dynamic courses both in comprehensive and subject-specific learning. During the first two semesters, students are mainly offered multidisciplinary courses providing food for thought which helps in adopting an interactive/integrated approach in the identification of economic issues. The scheme of studies for the second year also includes theoretical and analytical courses in their own subject area that equips them with fundamental analytical skills. The last two years are exclusively devoted to the studies in broader discipline of Economics taking students a long way in learning advance theoretical perspectives and analytical methods. The students are also encouraged to opt for a research thesis of 6 credit hours in lieu of two elective courses. A Bachelor's degree in Economics and Economics & Finance from FJWU prepares graduates to make informed choices for a higher degree program in several social science disciplines including business, economics, public policy, governance, public finance and many more. The Department has also initiated Bachelor's and Associate Degree in Economics & Finance in 2023. The curriculum is spread over eight semesters (4 years) and four semesters (2 years) of rich and dynamic courses both in comprehensive and subject-specific learning.

The Department has initiated Associate Degree in Economics in 2020 and in Economics and Finance in 2023 to expand the scope and outreach of the Programs. An associate Degree in Economics prepares the student for both the workforce and further education. The scheme of Studies for Associate Degree is designed in accordance with both the HEC guidelines and the scheme of studies for Bachelors in Economics, and Economics and Finance, in the Department. It is plausible alternative to 2 years' Bachelor's Degree with broad-based education and better opportunities. The Department frequently invites renowned national and international economists and public policy makers in the colloquiums organized in their

honor. These colloquiums familiarize students with the tradition of active participation in contemporary and dynamic issues and debates.

The department has organized its 2nd International Conference on 'Sustainable Development in Contemporary World: Priorities, Challenges and Prospects' from 4-6 October, 2022 with the World Bank's collaboration, for the students and faculty from FJWU and other educational institutes and research organization in the field of Economics. A symposium Under NRPU Project No. 11739 titles "Climate Change Risk and Human Security: A Study of selected Districts of Punjab" was also organized by the Department of Economics for students and faculty. A series of annual workshop on the "The Philosophy and Techniques for Quantitative Research" has also been initiated from the year 2018 for the students of Economics and Economics and Finance, and other relevant disciplines nationally. The workshop helps students in understanding the inherent philosophy of research along with developing a profound base for model building and data analysis. Furthermore, the department also organized Research Colloquium for showcasing and sharing students' research work. The participation in research conferences and seminars all over Pakistan is encouraged and facilitated. The research students also get the opportunity of research assistantship in funded National and International Projects by the Department of Economics. In addition to it, as per HEC guidelines, students will also be able to work on Capstone Project which will be led by Industrial Heads and Supervisors; providing students with more and better futuristic opportunities.

Founded in 1998, the Department of English at Fatima Jinnah Women University fosters an interdisciplinary approach to language and literature. Since its inception, the department has seen thirteen graduating classes for Bachelors programs and twenty for Masters programs. In 2007, the department established a landmark MPhil program leading to a PhD in English. Recognizing the evolving academic needs and the breadth of coursework offered, the MPhil and PhD programs were restructured in 2015 to provide specialized tracks in Literature and Linguistics.

The Department is represented by a strong permanent faculty of both Linguistics and Literature which is further enhanced by experienced adjunct faculty. From time to time foreign faculties are invited not only to deliver seminars, sessions, and workshops for our students but also to teach regular courses. For instance, from 2013 to 2016

foreign professors taught courses at various levels under the SFHP program of HEC and the United States Educational Foundation Pakistan (USEFP) program. We also successfully developed various academic and research links with various foreign universities such as the Department of Education, University of Birmingham (UK) under the auspices of the Centre for Bilingualism and Multilingualism Social and Institutional Context (MOSAIC) with the University of London and University of Reading (UK). In continuation of its efforts to increase collaboration with other institutions, the department signed an MoU with the Department of English, Air University, Islamabad in November 2023. This MoU beckons a dynamic environment of knowledge exchange that will undoubtedly accelerate research output, and faculty development, and propel both departments towards even greater scholarly achievements.

The Department also enjoys a strong research

tradition. The prolific research output of faculty members in different conferences, journals, and books is commendable. Research papers, projects, and theses focus on themes emerging from the various areas covered in the relevant courses and the contemporary literary and linguistic context of the country.

The department has been organizing an annual national conference titled the Annual National Conference on Linguistics and Literature (ANCLL) since 2019, focusing on emerging trends in linguistics and literature research. This conference provides the students with an opportunity to present their research work and form linkages with researchers and academicians from across the country.

The Department of English is resolute in its quest to always keep abreast with the contemporary developments in academics and research fields. The scheme of studies of the department reflects its commitment to offering a multicultural curriculum. The current scheme of studies has many unique features that make it representative of the traditions and contemporary models in the study of the English Language, Linguistics, and Literature. The literature courses start at the MPhil/PhD level and cover Literary Theory and Practice, Modern and Contemporary Poetry and Post-Colonial Literature etc., whereas the language and linguistics courses comprise Intercultural Pragmatics, Applied Linguistics, Contemporary Feminist Linguistics Theories etc.

A variety of courses are offered at the undergraduate level. Literature courses are based on traditional as well as innovative and creative approaches. The students not only study the established areas such as Classical and Romantic Poetry, Classical Drama, conventional novels and prose but also contemporary literary masterpieces in novels and shorter fiction. Literature written in English around the world is also an important constituent of the scheme. Courses in American, Canadian, and Pakistani Literature written in English are introduced to give the students an awareness of the current literary traditions around the world.

The language component of the Undergraduate level includes courses related to General Linguistics, Applied Linguistics / TEFL / TESL/ Phonetics and Phonology, Morphology,

Syntax, Grammar, Stylistics, Sociolinguistics, Psycholinguistics, and Pragmatics. Offering such a wide range of language-related areas is an attempt to introduce the students to the current pedagogical and linguistics paradigms. Furthermore, summer semesters are utilized to enrich the knowledge and skills of students. Short, intensive courses are offered in areas like Artificial Intelligence, Communication Skills, Presentation Skills, Reading and Writing Skills, Functional English, Creative Writing, etc. The knowledge and skills imparted in these areas also prepare the students for a resourceful output in the job market. during the academic semesters, the students are required to make presentations, carry out projects, conduct academic research, participate in class discussions, and transcode from one medium to another. thus, they are not only encouraging them to think creatively and analytically but also to make them pursue viable professions as academics, journalist, content writers, and teacher trainers.

Apart from curricular activities, our students are throughout engaged in participating in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. They are motivated to venture into the areas of their interest. The Department has a strong tradition of participating in declamations and debates, essay writing and story writing competitions, writing and reciting poetry, singing, writing, and performing in plays at intra/ inter-university levels. Steady progress and numerous laurels won by our students is a reflection of the motivation and dedicated guidance provided to them by the faculty of the Department.

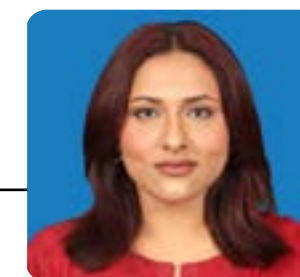

This information can be further used to enhance the standard of living for mankind.

The purpose of offering this program is to cultivate biological data analysis skills in our students as currently biomedical sciences have become more data-driven and bioinformatics is pivotal to all these areas. Bioinformaticians use computer technologies to extract information from biological records. They work in the fields of computational genomics, human genome sequencing, drug therapeutics, and translational research. Research and development are incomplete nowadays without the involvement of bioinformatics tools. The science of Bioinformatics is essential to understanding human diseases and identifying new molecular targets for drug discovery. Clinical practices, personalized medicine, agriculture, and forensic science all have a high demand for bioinformaticians. Bioinformatics has many uses in the bioenergy, veterinary research, and biotechnology manufacturing sectors. Bioinformatics graduates are required by a variety of pharmaceutical firms, healthcare organizations, biotech companies, and educational institutions. This department will train students through hands-on practice with real biological datasets in state-of-the-art computer labs, using bioinformatics software and databases. 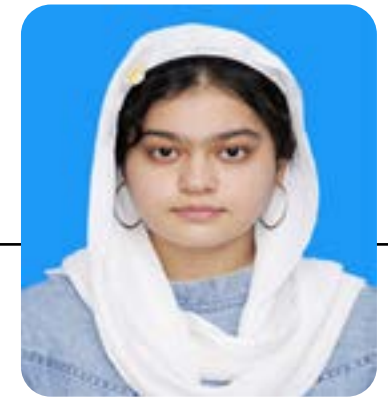

Each program will be comprised of 4 semesters. In semester I and Semester II, students will study courses and in III and IV semesters they will have thesis and non-thesis options to complete the 30 credit hours requirement of the MS degree program.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

- The minimum requirements for admission in a Master's degree program are Sixteen years' education in a relevant subject with a minimum CGPA of 2.5 (on a scale of 4.0).
- A department test will be conducted as an entrance test with a 50% score as a pass criterion.

FOUR-YEAR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM

Department of Law offers a 4-year LLB degree

program. This program aims to expose students to a wide range of disciplinary approaches to legal study and also emphasizes upon the variety of ways of understanding law's role in contemporary society. Bachelor program focuses on basic principles of law along with their jurisprudential rationale, civil and criminal law jurisdictions and the national and international perspective of laws. Substantive and procedural laws and its effective application in solving legal issues is being taught, for which moot court competitions are held to sharpen the students' legal skills. Furthermore, the teaching methodology encompasses a critical, comparative approach in order to broaden their analytical perspectives.

In addition to the knowledge of core law subjects, a variety of general and foundation courses as per HEC's curriculum expose the students to diversify their learning environment. As a result, Law students have actively participated in national and international moot court competitions. To ingrain litigation skills, to understand the procedural processes, and to get knowledge about the court proceedings, a ten-week mandatory internship (3 credit hours) after sixth semester is also offered, in which students are placed in different law firms and offices to have a firsthand knowledge of litigation and court's procedures before the completion of their degree. It is also mandatory to undertake community work to develop a sense of social responsibility in students. Furthermore, students are also required to undertake research pertaining to any legal issue in their last semester, in order to suggest viable solution and appropriate recommendations to the law makers. Upon the accomplishment of degree, our law students

are able to contribute in the national development process by participating in the fields of the academia, legal industry, legal research, civil bureaucracy, judiciary, private sector, and policy making bodies.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE

IN PUBLIC HEALTH

As vividly revealed by the COVID-19 pandemic, public health is the science and art of promoting health, preventing disease and injury, as well as prolonging life through organized efforts of society. The study of public health stems from the need to advocate, educate and keep communities healthy. A Bachelor's in Public Health is an undergraduate degree that mostly focuses on the 4 "Ps" of public health: prevention, promotion, protection, and population-based care, and provides an individual with the skills needed to enter into a wide variety of fields within public health, which includes not only disease prevention but also policy formulation or advocacy through education. Public Health and Allied Sciences is the first department, which has been established in 2022 under the new Faculty of Medicine, Dentistry and Pharmacy.

With the rise of Artificial Intelligence, QEC has integrated AI detection into its similarity index analysis, reinforcing ethical standards and safeguarding academic integrity in the era of advanced technologies.

QUALITY OF TEACHING & LEARNING

For the implementation of academic quality standards in instruction, learning and research, QEC has established internal and external mechanisms for continuous self-improvement and a variety of assessment tools (Proforma 1-10), which help to assess and improve the quality of services and programs offered at the university. QEC facilitates

departments in evaluation of courses, instructors and infrastructure through Teacher and Course Evaluation, Course Review Reports, Graduating Students, Alumni and Employer Survey and Faculty Satisfaction Survey to seek feedback and continuous quality improvement (CQI). REGISTRAR OFFICE

The Registrar's Office plays an important part in building, regulating, and governing the University under the direct supervision of the Vice Chancellor. It helps in interpreting the rules and regulations of the university and their proper implementation for streamlining the function of the university. The Office of the Registrar is principally engaged to serve the faculty and students of the university with the key principle of maintaining confidentiality of the official as well as personal records of the faculty, staff, and students. It provides support for the academic as well as administrative activities /functions of the university. It extends support for recruitment, placement, and capacity building of the faculty and administrative staff of the university. It also keeps a comprehensive record of the new entrants as well as alumni. The registrar also serves as the Secretary of the Statutory bodies of the university such as the Syndicate, Selection Board, Academic Council, and Advanced Studies and Research Board (ASRB). It represents the university on various international and national forums and coordinates with foreign and local universities and think tanks for collaborative research projects and joint ventures. It also provides the services of the liaison office for international students.

ADMISSION OFFICE

The Admission Office provides a central service to the public for information and management of admission procedures for applicants desirous of getting enrolled in Undergraduate and Post Graduate Programs of the University. All admissions to every department are processed strictly on merit. The Office disseminates information on entry criteria and admission formalities through advertisements in print media and the FJWU website for the public. It maintains the data of applicants and enrolled students. This office remains the first point of contact for potential

prospective students until their enrolments in the university. It also deals with specific students' affairs such as semester breaks and clearance after the completion of studies.

STUDENT FINANCIAL AID OFFICE (SFAO)

Students Financial Aid Office (SFAO) looks into and manages the administration of Merit of Need-Based Scholarships. It identifies the available resources, and evaluates the student's eligibility for scholarships available, depending on needs- analysis. It also liaises with the donor agencies and forwards them the recommendations of universities for allocations for specific scholarships. FJWU enjoys the support of national and international donors like the Punjab Educational Endowment Fund (PEEF), DIYA, Mitsubishi, USAID, HEC, Bait-UI-Mall, Ministry of Religious Affairs (MORA), Civil Society Human and Institutional Development Program (CHIP), EHSAS Undergraduate Scholarship Program, etc. SFAO continuously endeavors to find donors for more scholarships. the university even supports some students out of its resources. Students in need of financial support respond to related advertisements soon after the commencement of the fresh session. the SFAO guides the students to scholarship programs according to their needs, eligibility, and suitability of the said programs.

STUDENT AFFAIRS OFFICE

The Student Affairs Office at Fatima Jinnah Women University is dedicated to fostering a vibrant and supportive campus community that promotes the holistic development and well-being of students. COURSES COORDINATOR OFFICE (CCO)

The interviews, contracts of visiting faculty members, and their payment bills are prepared in this office. Experience certificates of the visiting faculty members are issued from this office. CCO also coordinates with all departments for

the issuance of university identity cards to the students and visiting faculty members.

It liaisons with the respective faculty deans for the administration and management of courses offered in postgraduate and undergraduate programs. CCO also coordinates the management of various facilities and resources for faculty members.

The contracts of full-time faculty and staff, visiting faculty, thesis supervisors, and their payment bills are prepared in this office. Different office orders and notices are also issued by this office. Records of earned and casual leaves, personal files, and service books are also maintained and updated in the admin office.

2. It provides logistics support in organizing different events of the university along with the arrangements of refreshments.
3. It liaisons with all the departments in the university
4. It deals with the university cafeteria shops, university quarters, security, and purchases.
5. It allocates duties of drivers, naib qasids, and sanatory workers.
6. It circulates notices and helps in the issuance of furniture and stationery.

7. It is responsible for the publication of Tender Notices and Advertisements of the university.

8. It maintains the records of photographs and CDs of different events.

9. It keeps a check on the cleanliness of university premises.

ACCOUNTS OFFICE

The Accounts Office is responsible for managing the property, the finances, and the investment of the university funds. The Accounts Office comprises the Establishment / Payroll Section, Development Expenditure Section, Recurring Expenditure Section, Fee Section, and Audit Liaison Section and it is headed by the Treasurer / Chief Financial Officer.

The detailed working of the office is as follows;

Prepares the annual and revised budget estimates of the university and presents them to the Finance & Planning Committee and the Syndicate for approval.

- Process payments from different approved budget heads after completing all the codal and financial formalities.
- Ensures that the funds of the university are expended for the purposes they are provided.
- Prepares consolidated annual statements of the accounts.
- Verification of the fee deposits and maintenance of the financial data and records. Reimbursement/Refund of various fees / Security claims.
- Preparation and disbursement of payroll of all the employees.
- Disbursement of various scholarships to regular students i.e. (Punjab Educational Endowment Fund) (PEEF), HEC Need-Based and Merit, Scholarship, Japanese Need-Based Scholarship, University Need-Based Scholarship, Ministry of Religious Affairs (MORA) Scholarship, United States Aid For International Development (USAID)

Scholarship DIYA Scholarship, Bait-Ul-mall Scholarship, Civil Society Human and Institutional Development (CHIP) Scholarship, Mitsubishi Scholarship, EHSAS undergraduate Scholarship from various donors/organizations.

- To deduct the withholding taxes as per government rules and deposit the same in the government treasury
- Getting the accounts audited by the Auditor General Audit Punjab annually.
- Representing the university at different forums.

EXAMINATION OFFICE

The objective of the Examination Office is to execute high quality and legally secure system in addition to offering services for students, instructors, and administrators related to exams. The examination office ensures the administration of the University Grading System, students' academic status, their appeal (if any) regarding results, the printing of academic transcripts and degrees for graduating students, medals for students with distinctions, and the holding of annual convocation. FJWU Examination rules and regulations are given on the FJWU Official Website.

THE OFFICE OF RESEARCH, INNOVATION AND COMMERCIALIZATION (ORIC)

The Office of Research, Innovation, and Commercialization (ORIC) aims to provide strategic and operational support to the university's research, commercialization, and entrepreneurship-developing activities. Established in the year 2012, ORIC has been successful in creating awareness about well-informed culture that is linked to research, entrepreneurship, and socio-economic priorities of FJWU and its broader community.

To fulfill its purposes, ORIC provides support in the identification of funding opportunities, capacity building of faculty, staff, and students through various training programs enterprise development, industry liaison, and

commercialization of existing facilities and resources. So far ORIC has supported 26 research projects. In the year 2019, project funding increased to Rs. 48 million

The university has filed 2 patents, out of which one was granted in the field of environmental chemistry, ORIC facilitates and helps departments to connect to different national and international organizations/ institutions. thus far, ORIC has established collaborative linkages with 48 national and 45 international partners.

ORIC has already established the Fatima Jinnah Women Entrepreneurship Development Centre (FJDEDC) This facility is sponsored by the Direct Aid Program (DAP) of the Australian High Commission, Islamabad.

The center has a well-equipped incubation center that helps female students and faculty develop their entrepreneurial capacities, assist with legal and technical resources, connect to mentors, and use co-working space to convert their business ideas into sustainable businesses. The center has incubated 7 startups, out of which 4 have graduated. Some of the incubated companies have won seed funding amounting to Rs.0.5 million. In addition, to create an entrepreneurial culture within the university, trainings on developing entrepreneurial skills among students and faculty have been arranged and thus, more than five hundred potential entrepreneurs have been trained. This program is supported by local, national, and international partners, intellectuals, development experts, chambers, and the local community. Furthermore, entrepreneurial courses and

undergraduate levels are being offered by different departments under the guidance of the center. To make it more sustainable, the Youth Entrepreneurial Society (YES) and FJWU-RCCI Youth Club have been established recently. The student societies aim to create the next generation of leaders through an open platform for educational training, professional guidance, and long-term mentoring

FJWU is in the process of establishing a Centre for Learning Excellence; the center will initially be supervised and guided by FJWU ORIC. The mandate of the center will be to build the capacities of the faculty and staff of the University as well as target different universities in the country. This mandate is further extended to industries and communities to develop their capacities and competencies to overcome problems through research and training. This mandate will be covered by two sections of the center:

- Executive Development Unit
- Faculty Development Unit

TRANSPORT OFFICE

FJWU provides accessible, comfortable, secure economical, and reliable transportation facilities to staff and students to and from the designated bus stops. The University has busses, coasters, and vans that cover most parts of the twin cities' Road up to Gujjar Khan and Peshawar Road up to Wah Cantt. These vehicles depart once a day on weekdays from pickup spots on all roots. FJWU charges normally a transport fee/amount for this service.



PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DIRECTORATE



INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT WORKS

The Directorate of Planning and Development is the backbone of an organization, playing a fundamental role in its growth and development. The Directorate of Planning & Development works under the supervision, guidance, and leadership of the Vice Chancellor. The role of this department is to assess the current and future needs for physical and academic infrastructure and prepare plans accordingly. All development projects are prepared by this Directorate and submitted to HEC, the Punjab Government, and different forums. The Directorate is headed by the Director (P&D).

Following is a brief description of the projects recently executed / currently under execution.

DEVELOPMENT OF FJWU, CAMPUS-II (LOCATED AT CHAKRI ROAD, RAWALPINDI)

The University is in the process of establishing its Campus-II at Chakri Road Rawalpindi, at a distance of 16 km from the City Campus. A residential campus spread over about 2,333 kanals of land with over 6 million square feet of covered area has been planned to cater for the requirements of over 25,000 students. Current status of development at Campus-II is as under:

In Phase-1 of the subject project following works

have been executed: Reception / Security Office/ Main Entrance Gate, Boundary Wall, Roads and Walkways (Partial), External Plumbing Works (Partial), External Electric Works (Partial), 1 x Overhead Water Tank, Site Office, required Project Staff, Master Planning/Consultancy and HRD scholarships.

In Phase-2 of subject project 2 x Academic Blocks for 6 departments i.e. Biotechnology, Bioinformatics, Physics, Electronics Engineering, Commerce and Law, Girls Hostel (1 in No.) and Partial External Development Works.

SOLARIZATION AT FJWU - CAMPUS I & CAMPUS II

The project has been successfully completed at both campuses and is now fully operational with an installed capacity of 756.38 kWp.
