Brief History

Fatima Jinnah Women University (FJWU) has been established in the premises of The Old Presidency, situated at The Mall, in the heart of Rawalpindi Cantonment.

Our heritage has been beautifully interlinked with the education of women. The main building is Victorian, as reflected in its architectural splendor. This building was originally built as a residence by two famous Sikh brothers, Mohan Singh and Sohan Singh. It became the presidency of Pakistan around the mid 1960's. The rooms are steeped in history: personalities like Ms. Benazir Bhutto, Mr. Ch. Fazal Elahi and President Zia-ul-Haq have walked the corridors of this building.

Former Prime Minister Mian Muhammad

Nawaz Sharif inaugurated this gift for the nation's daughters and their families on August 6, 1998. It stands as a symbol of the commitment of the nation to women education. The university is unique in the fact that the Punjab Government funds it. The Government of Punjab is very supportive of the university, thereby, furthering the cause of women education and empowerment.

Classes were initiated at FJWU on December 28, 1998 and the first batch of

students graduated in September 2001.

Students have been coming from all over the country from as far as Balochistan, Southern Punjab, and Sindh. To date, about 21,448 students have successfully graduated and awarded degrees by the University. A large number is effectively employed in various organizations in and outside the country.

Women working at the university have made history in diverse ways. The university offers courses that are compatible with international standards. Thus, it opens the doors of opportunities for women. Educational institutions from all over the world have been in touch with FJWU to develop Exchange Programs and collaborations.

Students are also involved in the functioning of these societies; therefore, these societies are beneficial for them. They get practical experience through organizing various events and their personalities are also

Sports Activities

Fatima Jinnah Women University Rawalpindi provides well-organized top ranked facilities for sports to its students with a whole calendar of events to ensure that they enjoy a full and varied campus life. It regularly holds various kinds of competitions round the year, providing students an opportunity to display their talent. The university has a proper sports system and procedure of information via sports orientation on campus through the year and motivational graphs to achieve their target. Students have an open merit opportunity to be part of the university team. Each semester we plan a wide range of sports activities, and events for students and employees of FJWU.

Besides creating an individual workout plan adapted to the training objectives, the coach also takes care of the trainee during the training process with corrections and adjustments of the workout plan to achieve the desired training objectives in optimal time and manner.

Previously FJWU participated in International (world University Games at Bangkok, Thailand) National Intervarsity Championships, Youth Festivals, twin city Competition as well, and achieved victory in different sports. Students also have the opportunity to get cash prizes by winning in different competitions. One judo player secured an HEC sports Scholarship against her achievements at National level. Many other players have received cash prizes at different levels of competitions.

Fatima Jinnah Women University is committed to provide students and faculty/staff, with the resources they need and to make those resources readily available for their use.

Library

Fatima Jinnah Women University Library. which houses a wealth of knowledge and information, came into existence in 1998 with the founding of the university. The library was initially located in the old Presidency, a building rich in heritage and architectural beauty. It remained in the old building up to 2006, after which it was shifted to the upper floor of (Academic Block I) to accommodate the library's growing collection. Now, in the year 2020, a major part of the Library collection is shifted to the basement of the sports complex. The library has established its repute by providing excellent services and facilities to fulfill needs of our students. The library is manned by qualified and experienced professionals, all dedicated to provide high quality innovative services.

Library Location

The main library has two locations and one departmental library at building of Education department. Main location one, comprises of Computer Lab, Periodical section, UN Corner and SBARR (Susan B. Anthony Reading Room) located in the upper floor of Academic Block I. Second main location located in the basement of Sports Gymnasium comprises of the general books section and reference section. Circulation services are being provided in this location.

Library Collection

The library's mission is to provide support to the academic and scholarly endeavor of users, in their core instructional and research requirements through utilizing the best possible resources, systems and services. The library has a rich collection of materials, including books, journals, magazines, videos, CD-ROMs, DVDs, etc. The FJWU library has more than 50,000 books. The library has received donations from the IRC (Information Resource Center) of the American Embassy, the British Council, the Canadian High Commission, The Asia Foundation, the World Bank, the USIS, ministry of Women Development and Women Study Centers from all around the world. The

collection is ideally suited to encourage and support both academic and research activities of the university. The library has subscribed the databases of HEC digital library. A total of 14 newspapers come daily to library. Library also has Journals, Magazines, Government documents, Reports and surveys in its periodical room.

Library Services

FJWU provides Library Services regarding Book Lending, Reference Service and Searching Assistance.

- Book Lending: All registered users are entitled to borrow books and other materials according to the FJWU Library Policy. Please inquire at the Circulation Desk for your eligibility.
- Reference Service. An active help desk provides efficient and reliable service under the supervision of professional librarians.
- **Searching Assistance:** Self-searching systems are available in Library for seeking the call numbers of required books.
- Digital Library Facility: FJWU is also proud to offer online access to HEC digital library. HEC digital library program began in Pakistan in January 2005, and currently provides a vast collection of online resources to the researchers of Public and Private sectors universities with access to over 23,000 international scholarly ejournals. Access to high quality, peer reviewed journals and databases across a wide range of disciplines is available to support the research requirements of students and faculty.

Some online resources have also been subscribed for the users such as Pakistan Law site for the students of Law department. They can access books, journals theses and dissertations through this facility.

- SBARR (Susan B. Anthony Reading Room): The Susan B. Anthony Reading Room is a joint partnership program between FJWU and the Information Resource Center of the US Embassy Pakistan. It provides multimedia resources, English language materials, information about studying in the U.S., cultural activities, and lectures on topics of interests. Books, magazines, access to computers, internet and DVDs.
- United Nations Corner: UN Corner is a
 Joint partnership program between FJWU
 and United Nations Information Centre.
 Students have direct access to the useful
 information on the projects of United
 Nations in Pakistan and at global level. As
 an innovative bookshelf, the UN Corner
 serves as a bridge in rapport development
 between Pakistan and the World.
- Library Computer Lab: Library has 26 computers in its lab for the use of library users. All the systems are connected with the internet facility. Some important soft wares are installed in all the systems.

Radio VoW started its transmission on August 14, 2006 in collabration with USAID. It is the project of Communication and Media Studies which is run and managed by a women university. FJWU Campus Radio has the following aims and objectives:

To bring educational and informational programming to the FJWU students.

To provide a platform to the students to build their communication skills and give them exposure to the working media environment. Radio Station also acts as Community Radio addressing community issues and building awareness about them.

Radio VoW FM 96.6 MHz also provides hands-on training to media students. It trains them in various aspects of sound production, editing and anchoring.

Radio VoW broadcasts live transmission for five days a week from 11:00am to 2:00pm and repeat broadcast from 3:00pm to 6:00pm. Radio Programs are produced and broadcast by the Student Assistants, Interns and Volunteer Students under the supervision of Ms.Roqia Khurshid (Assistant Producer Radio VoW).

Radio VoW acknowledges national & international days like International Women's Day, International Literacy Day, International Book Reading Day and International Global Warming Day etc.

It not only broadcasts special programs but also organizes Interdepartmental Competitions on Special Days i.e 12th Rabi ul Awal, Independence Day & Quaid Day to enrich skills of students.

Student Services

Placement Office

Placement Office at Fatima Jinnah Women University provides a link between the job market and University students. This office is committed to providing all possible assistance to its graduates in their efforts to find employment. It not only furnishes information about job opportunities for students and alumni but also equips them with the pre-requisites of the jobs through seminars on Career Counseling. Seminars, lectures and workshops are arranged in order to orient students for jobs. Guests are also invited from different organizations to give an insight into the professional arena.

Staff is available to respond to students' questions and concerns of all kinds. This may include advice on hiring procedures, helping with preparation of applications and resumes, and assisting with practice interviews. Advice is based upon up-to-date placement statistics and an informed view of educational and market trends; the aim is to ensure that our graduates have the information and skills necessary for an effective job search.

Placement Office arranges internships for students in areas relevant to their departments. It coordinates with the organizations, monitors the internship programs and keeps all record of internship activities.

Students are screened and their resumes are reviewed before they are sent for interviews. Data regarding organizations, resource persons and other organizational information is constantly updated and made available to students. Job and vacancy advertisements are posted daily on the Job Board. An Alumni Secretariat is maintained at the Placement Office where the updated record of alumni and their placement is kept.

Cafeteria

The University has two large cafeterias which provide snacks and regular meals at discounted rates. The Cafeteria Committee ensures good hygienic standards. The cafeteria has been renovated recently. Attractive environment and added varieties of food-stuff help the students relax here in the break between their classes.

University Medical Center (UMC)


University Medical Center is functioning under the supervision of a highly qualified, experienced and competent Senior Medical Officer Dr. Huma Jehangir.

UMC provides first aid to the staff and students of the FJWU.

Health care of the students and staff of the Fatima Jinnah Women University has always been on the priority list of FJWU. Keeping this in view FJWU has Medical Center and a Day Care that provide all the first aid medical facilities and medical assistance for minor emergencies. The center keeps arranging different awareness programs and beneficial programs for the students, faculty and staff of the University. The staff comprises Senior Medical Officer, Resident Medical Officer, One Head Nurse, 02 Staff-Nurses, and 08 maids.

The clinic provides medical facilities throughout the year which include the following:

Emergency Treatments, Prescriptions and medication in OPD, Infusions, I/M pain killers and anti-allergy medicines, Oral medication, Nebulization, Dressing of the wounds, Routine checkups of blood pressure and temperature, Random glucose tests etc. The Center is fully equipped for all emergencies and transfer of patients to hospitals is also available. An Ambulance, wheel chair and stretcher are available for emergency use.



Bank

First Women Bank has its branch at FJWU to facilitate the university administration, staff and students. Students deposit their dues in this branch. This facilitates the boarders as well as the day scholars.

Students' Accommodation

FJWU offers residential facility to the out stationed students, in principle. Currently more than 800 students from all over Pakistan are residing in the furnished halls of the city campus (Wing I, II & III). City Campus Halls have huge mess area, lawns, prayer room, visitors' lounge, TV lounge and large rooms for common study. Indoor sports facilities are also available. Faculty and staff members are entrusted with the charge of individual hostels (called Halls).

Prof. Dr. Azra Yasmin is the Chairperson Hall Council at present. She along with the other staff (In-charges, Assistants), supervises the smooth functioning of FJWU hostels keeping in view the following:

- Daily functioning of the residences
- Issues pertaining to the hostel residents
- Policies and procedures

Afull time student admitted to any department in the University is eligible to apply for accommodation in the University hostels, provided she has no accommodation available in Rawalpindi/ Islamabad. Furthermore, she must not be employed anywhere, in any capacity, in Rawalpindi/ Islamabad nor receiving any house rent subsidy.

Hostel accommodation is not a matter of right. It is a facility provided by the University, subject to the availability of seats.

- Applications for accommodation in the University hostels shall be submitted on the prescribed forms in the manner laid down by the University. Only those applications will be considered that are submitted within due date.
- All hostel dues are deposited in the First Women Bank Branch at FJWU Campus.
- Students residing in the University hostels outside University Campus are provided with university transport facility.
- An intending resident who does not occupy the allotted seat by the notified date shall lose her seat, unless she seeks re-allotment, which shall depend on availability of seat. However, a student can retain her seat on ground of illness, supported by necessary medical certificate.
- A resident desirous of leaving the hostel within first week of admission/commencement of classes is eligible to a full refund of hostel dues. Further more hostel dues refund policy details are mentioned on the page "Cost of Residential Services".
- Hostel advisory committee reserves the right to cancel the admission from the hostel on disciplinary/moral or other grounds.

FJWU Centers

1. Information Technology Center

IT Center has 23 well-equipped, State-of-the-art Computer Labs and more than 1500 Computers have been networked. Computer Labs are equipped to meet specific program needs and they are constantly updated to meet the required software/hardware. Students are required to abide by a code of conduct when using the computers.

The Center has a dedicated video-conferencing facility and 155 Mbps of internet connectivity for use of students and staff. The Center has also installed 64 multimedia projectors in almost all classrooms of the University.

The maintenance of electronics equipment, computers and multimedia equipment is carried out by our own technicians, and a sickbay has been established for this purpose. The Center collaborates with the overall plan of education, sciences, technology-thrust and development of IT in the country. The IT Center provides a wide range of services and seamless access to electronic information which helps in producing specialists in the field.

FJWU has launched a massive program primarily to train women in IT. Therefore, the acceptance of our students in the market has been stupendous. The Center, which remains open throughout the year, provides state-of-the-art telecommunication facility to the Staff and Students.

Section 18.1

FJWU has secured Wi-Fi Network consisting of 32 Indoor and 4 Outdoor Access Points, which have been integrated with the existing LAN in the University. This is facilitating all Staff and Students and faculty to use Internet connectivity through their wireless cards within the University premises.

A wide variety of licensed software is held by the IT Center and installed in labs for use by all concerned. IT Center has started Biometric Attendance System for all Faculty and Staff, a move for paperless environment.

For security purpose, IT Center has deployed fully equipped Security System for the University. This security system consists of CCTV Cameras and two Security Walkthrough Gates at the entrances of the University. Electronic Security Management Wing has been established by IT Department for 24/7 monitoring of CCTV Cameras.

IT Center has launched a VPN Server that enables access to Digital Library from outside University to Faculty & Students. Users are able to access the Digital Library by establishing a VPN Connection to FJWU VPN-Server.

IT Center also collaborates with Registrar's office for distributing Laptops to Students under Prime Minister and Chief Minister Laptop Scheme.



2. Women Research and Resource Centre

The Women Resource Centre was established in 1999 to sensitize women on gender related issues and to focus upon the enhancement of education and employment opportunities for the students of Fatima Jinnah Women University in all disciplines. In 2000, the Centre was renamed Women Research and Resource Centre to emphasize research on gender and social issues as also to reflect the academic and professional development of women in general and within the context of our society in particular.

Functions of WRRC

The Centre has four functions: Research, Teaching, Training and Networking.

(i) Research

Research is based on gender and social issues related to our own ethos and culture to make it relevant to our needs. Research is usually sponsored and reports/articles are published and presented for dissemination of results. Currently, WRRC is working on a project titled Climate Action, Gender, Youth and Leadership: A Community Service Project of FJWU, in partnership with Norwegian Church Aid -NCA under the European Union Power to the Youth Project (2022- 2024). It is a community-based climate change adaptation intervention that involves youth from underprivileged communities.

(ii) Teaching

Teaching of gender related courses is part of the portfolio of WRRC. The Centre offers courses which are interdisciplinary in nature regarding various gender oriented development issues. WRRC offers 'Gender, Youth and Development' Course at Bachelor's level and this is offered across the board to all the students. Successful completion of this course is mandatory for the degree.

WRRC also offers Post-Graduate Diploma in Higher Education Leadership and Management - HELM.

WRRC, in collaboration with British Council, conducts 'British Council Citizenship Education and Community Engagement Program-Active Citizen General Education Course' a 3 CHs course in September, 2016.

(iii) Training and sensitization workshops

The Centre is actively involved in organizing national and international level workshops. Training that is carried out is need based and is tailored according to the needs of clients/sponsors and also for the faculty and staff of the university. 3. Day Care Center

FJWU Day Care Center is a full time facility provided to the children of FJWU Faculty, Staff and Students and is a smart solution for parents who have day jobs. Day Care have many advantages that both children and parents can enjoy.

The age limit of day care children has been increased to three and half years and after that they are eligible to be shifted to early childcare center. The DCC runs under full supervision of the university. The day care staff comprises of In Charge, Teacher cum assistant, Head Caregiver and fourteen fully trained caregivers. The DCC rooms are bifurcated according to the age group. At the time of admission in day care, application is forwarded through department to Incharge day care who takes administrative approval from authorities. Day Care is fully equipped with heating and cooling systems, CCTV Cameras are installed for surveillance. Day care is much more than play time and nap time. There are basic educational benefits for old toddlers who are being prepared for enrollment in school. LEDs are installed in all the three rooms to entertain the children and they also learn from listening rhymes and stories.





4. Early Child Care Center (ECCC):

The Early Child Care Center (ECCC) runs under full-supervision of the university. It is supervised by Dr. Farhana Khurshid. The Early Child Care Center (ECCC) facility is available to university faculty, administration and married students. The ECCC is for babies of age 3.5 years to 10 years old. The staff of ECCC comprised of one teacher and ten caregivers. ECCC take care of children as per their age and involve them in different activities for their mental and physical growth. These activities include, paintings, formation of letters, crafting, indoor and outdoor games, and gardening opportunities are also provided. ECCC also worked on motor skills of students, e.g., wall chalk activity for pencil gripping. The medical check-up of the children is also done regularly by the medical center doctor.

After school children come to ECCC in afternoon and their care is taken accordingly.





5. Collaboration and Linkages Center

In Keeping with Higher Education Commission (HEC) directive, Collaboration and Linkages Center (CLC) has been established at FJWU to develop and enhance opportunities for attaining international standards in teaching and research.

The basic aim of the CLC is to explore the research areas / programs and departments for the placement of its Ph.D. Scholars and explore the possibilities of split Ph.D. degrees and faculty research. The present project of CLC is to build functional and mutually beneficial relationship with local and international institutions.

6. Psychological Test Resource Center (PTRC)

The department of Behavioral Sciences offers psychological testing, assessment services, and research protocol provision. These services are available to other academic institutions and departments. The facility maintains an excellent repository of psychological tests and inventories for neuropsychological, cognitive, developmental, and personality assessment. Furthermore, indigenous-developed scales, and translated and adapted instruments are available for purchase and use in research by other students and academicians from other institutions.

7. Counselling and Wellness Centre

Counselling and wellness centre at Fatima Jinnah Women University strives to foster a healthy, caring community which would be beneficial for physical, social and emotional wellbeing of individuals. The centre is being involved in the psychological profiling. assessment, counselling and interventions for students, faculty and staff. Series of webinars, seminars, counselling camps, mental health weeks and workshops are being conducted in collaboration with other universities and organizations. These activities help to address common mental health issues and enhance overall quality of life and wellbeing of community. Moreover, specific workshops are being conducted for stress and anxiety management, mindfulness based techniques for mood disorders, pain management and other psychosocial issues associated traumatic events such as COVID 19 pandemic. Appropriate facilities for assessment and counseling services are also provided for general population and clients referred by other mental health professionals.

8. National Centre for Research on Suicide Prevention (NCRSP)

Country's first National Centre for Research on Suicide Prevention (NCRSP) is a recently

established Centre at Fatima Jinnah Women University. The centre was inaugurated on World Suicide Prevention Day 2021 by Mr. Riaz Fatyana, MNA/Convener National Parliamentary Taskforce on SDGs. The Centre is functional in collaboration with Pakistan Institute of Living and Learning (PILL) along with Global Mental Health Research Group, University of Manchester (UK) as an allied partners. The facility is located at ground floor of Sports Gymnasium of the University.

NCRSP as a dynamic centre of research with a particular focus on suicide and selfharm prevention in Pakistan is meant for innovative approaches to meet societal challenges in mental health through participation and collaboration and with commitment to change. The Centre aims to provide research based information for generating evidence and utilizing research evidence for informed policy, preventing suicidal tendencies, offering treatment care models, and promoting the healthy responsible behaviors in the society. We strive to be a catalyst for mental health research to ensure needed steps to improve mental ill health prevention and the provision of care in Pakistan.

9. The Center for Environmentally Sustainable Transport and Climate Change (CESTaC)

1. CESTaC – An Overview

Center for Environmentally Sustainable Transport and Climate Change (CESTaC) was established as an independent center housed at VC's Block at Fatima Jinnah Women University (FJWU) in 2015 through a Letter of Agreement (LOA) signed jointly by UNDP's PAKSTRAN project and Fatima Jinnah Women's University (FJWU) with technical assistance from the Faculty of Science & Technology (including Environmental Sciences) of FJWU.

CESTaC, Fatima Jinnah Women University (FJWU) is serving as a climate change and environmentally sustainable transport thinktank. The center is providing advisory and

technical support that is resulting in the formulation of policy papers, research proposals, concept notes, etc. on the environment, climate change, and transport-related topics. It is also organizing numerous capacity-building activities in collaboration with stakeholders/national & international donors.

CESTaC key objectives are:

- Carry out policy-oriented research in the field of environment, climate change, sustainable transport, etc., and disseminate knowledge to policymakers and other stakeholders.
- Coordinate with potential clients and donors to acquire service contracts, grants, funding, and research assignments to multiply research activities and also ensure the sustainability of CESTaC.
- Carry out training need assessments (TNAs), and provide professional training to the relevant partners and government departments for strengthening their R&D capacities.

2. Main Activities:

- Collaborate with relevant organizations and organize capacity-building activities (seminars, workshops, training) on the environment, climate change, and sustainable transport-related topics for relevant stakeholders.
- Extend supervision/facilitate students of FJWU in the completion of their research projects on environment protection, environmental data, transport (including evehicles), and sustainable developmentrelated topics.
- Launch the "CESTaC Internship Programme" for FJWU students.
- Explore suitable resource mobilization windows, formulate concept notes/proposals, and submit them to the concerned organizations within the due timelines thus ensuring the financial revival

- and sustainability of CESTaC at FJWU.
- Arrange boot camps/innovative ideas competition programs on environment protection, climate change, and environment-related data by engaging FJWU students.
- Engage students of FJWU for articles writing in magazines, newspapers/blogs, etc.
- Formulate/update general education courses on e-mobility, SDGs, environmental audit, and other related topics.

3. Key Achievements:

- Updated the General Education Course on "Sustainable Transport & Climate Change" with Electric Mobility modules.
- Prepared project concept note/proposal and submitted it to the relevant financial window (national and international) thus to mobilize resources.
- Launched the CESTaC internship program and engaged FJWU students in different activities at the center.
- Developed factsheets, brochures, and policy papers on the environment, climate change, and sustainable transport-related topics that will be disseminated to relevant stakeholders.
- Collaborated with International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) and organized the academic Launch of the climate change gender action plan (ccGAP) on 29th Dec 2022 at Fatima Jinnah Women University (FJWU), Rawalpindi. The honorable Chairman Higher Education Commission (HEC), the Respected Secretary Ministry of Water Resources, Esteemed Vice Chancellors of 05 women universities, and eminent experts from various walks of life joined the event and appreciated CESTaC's role in arranging a productive event.

10. Career Counselling Centre

The Punjab Higher Education Commission has funded for establishment of Career Counselling Center at Fatima Jinnah Women University. Academics

The academic year at FJWU comprises two regular semesters and one summer semester.

Bachelors Degree Program

A student at the Undergraduate level studying for her Bachelors degree shall complete 130 credit hours (inclusive of 6 credit hours thesis)

In addition to above, Community Work (20 contact hours) and Internship for 6-8 weeks shall be a compulsory component of all Bachelors degree programs and the minimum required CGPA shall be 2.0.

Students securing highest CGPA in their respective session may be eligible for special awards/medals.

Higher Degree Programs

Fatima Jinnah Women University offers Ms / M. Phil / Ph. D. programs consistent with the Higher Education commission (HEC) criteria requirements. These Programs require full time student enrollment for course work.

Scheme of Studies:

FJWU Board of Studies for respective disciplines recommends the Scheme of Studies for M. Phil. and Ph. D. program. The scheme is liable to be revised form time to time. The general layout is as follows:

a. M. Phil Semester I and Semester II:

The candidates are offered different courses in the first two semesters. A student is required to successfully complete 24 credit hours course work during this period.

b. M. Phil. Semester III & Semester IV:

After successful completion of first two semesters, synopsis of research thesis is required to be approved by the FJWU Board of Advanced Studies and Research.

Semester III & IV are specified for research and 06 credit hours of research is mandatory for the award of the M. Phil. degree.

c. Ph.D. Course Load and Research:

Ph.D. requires 18 hours of course work followed by a comprehensive examination. Then the Ph. D. synopsis is approved by FJWU Board of Advanced Studies and Research for Ph. D. thesis.

FJWU follows the criteria prescribed by Higher Education Commission. The program is regularly revised, updated and advertised accordingly.

FJWU ensures the quality of M. Phil. and Ph. D. programs throug h regular assessment, feedback and follow up by regulatory bodies of the university. Details of rules and regulations pertaining to M. Phil. / Ph. D. studies can be obtained from respective departments and at the orientation session.

Registration

Students have to complete registration formalities before the commencement of each semester, as per schedule notified by the Registrar's Office.

Any late registrations are subject to availability of seats in that course, and liable to payment of fine.

The plan of studies offered at FJWU reflects a holistic vision as per the recent educational reforms. However, this development essentially involves extended logistics specifically for managing General Education Courses where students are offered to opt for choices.

The option, nonetheless is limited in the sense that there is no possibility of re-visiting the choice. Students are facilitated to add / drop courses during a semester as per rules and after completion of due formalities.

Attendance

A minimum of 75% attendance per course is mandatory to be able to take the final term paper/s.

Grading Criteria

Absolute Grading Criteria is followed at FJWU from the year 2015 onwards.

How to Calculate GPA:

- Multiply the number of credit hours by the number of grade points to get the number of quality points for each course.
- Sum of Credit Hour column.
- Sum of Quality points in a semester.
- Divide the quality points by the credit hours to obtain the GPA in a semester.
- To calculate the Cumulative GPA, divide the number of total quality points earned by the total number of credit hours attempted.

The Evaluation System considers the following in and out-of-ordinary circumstances Faced by students:

Grading system for New induction from Fall 2019 (16 years Degree)

- Minimum qualifying CGPA for Graduate & Undergraduate Level is 2.0
- If the GPA is below 1.7, the student will be dropped from university rolls.
- However, she can seek fresh enrollment only once during 16 years degree Program.
- Those student acquiring GPA between 1.7-2.0 will be placed on probation and promoted with the condition to achieve GPA 2.0 and above in next semester.
- There shall be maximum two academics probations in 16 years degree program.
- Both the probations should not be granted /availed in first four semesters.
- A student who is on probation 2nd time in first four semesters shall be removed from rolls of university. However, she can seek fresh enrollment only once during 16 years degree program.

M.Phil. /Ph.D. Level

- Minimum qualifying CGPA for M.Phil. /Ph.D. Level is 2.50.
- Those students acquiring GPA between 1.75-2.50 will be placed on probation and

- promoted with the condition to achieve GPA 2.50 and above in next semester.
- A student with GPA below 1.75 in any semester shall be dropped from University rolls.

Repeating Courses:

Securing at least a pass grade is a must in all courses included in the Credit hour requirement. Failed course/courses, if any, are therefore to be necessarily repeated. In order to help improve their CGPA:

- Student of 16 Years of Schooling Degrees is allowed to repeat a course in which she has obtained grade below "C" i.e. C-.
- Student of MS/MPhil is allowed to repeat a course in which she has obtained grade "C".
- Student cannot be permitted repetition of course after the award of degree.

Dropping a Course

Students are also facilitated in cases where they wish to drop course/courses during a semester. However, recommendation of the department head and as per schedule notified by the Registrar's Office is necessary. Moreover, timing of deciding to drop course/courses happens to have some implications for award of respective letter-grade on the final transcript.

CGPA required for the Completion of Degree

If a student secures less than 2.00/2.50 CGPA at the end of final Semester, she is allowed to get re-admission in one or more courses, in which her Grade is below C, along with the forthcoming semester, provided that she is not debarred under the CGPA Improvement Regulation and time duration specified for the program.

Criteria for passing a Course

To pass a course, it is mandatory for a student to obtain at least 50% marks in Practical, Projects, Thesis, Assignments, Test and Theory Paper separately/aggregate.

Cancellation of Enrolment:

If a student fails to attend any lecture during the first four weeks without any information, after the commencement of the semester as per announced schedule, her admission shall stand cancelled automatically without any notification.

Breach of Examination Rules

Students are expected to be familiar with the Examination Rules, a breach of any of which will render a student liable to disciplinary action, which may result in the student's expulsion from the University.

Transfer

At the time of Admission, if the name of a candidate appears in the succeeding merit lists of any department, transfer will take place only on request and within the stipulated time of the respective merit list.

Migration

Migration / Transfer of credits from other universities (within the country and abroad) is possible as per university migration / transfer of credits rules. The facility entails a specific time frame, and a transfer fee for the consideration of the case. The decision of the case wil be subject to the approval of the Admission Committee.

Equivalence Requirements

As per HEC directives, no admission shall be granted to the students who studies O Level / Equivalent Education from abroad and A Level from Pakistan but have not studied the subjects of Urdu, Pakistan Studies and Islamiyat.

Required Number of Enrollment for Commencement of Classes

If the enrollment in any Department in Bachelors/Masters Program is less than 10 students at the time of admissions then that Department will not commence classes for that session and the student enrolled in that Department would be transferred to other departments, provided that:

- They fulfill the eligibility criteria for that Department
- Seats are available in that Department

A minimum enrollment of 5 students would be required in each department for running any M. Phil Program.

Degree Completion Time Period

The maximum period of degree completion will be limited to:

 8 years (including course work duration) for Ph.D. Program



Bachelors Program in Anthropology

Anthropology these days, has become a rising discipline, and is being taught at undergraduate and post-graduate levels at several universities across Pakistan. Anthropology is the study of human behavior and the exploration of what it means to be human, ranges from the study of culture and social relations, to human biology and evolution, to languages, to music, art, and architecture, and to vestiges of human habitation. It considers such fascinating questions as how peoples' behavior changes over time, how people move about the world, why and how people from distant parts of the world and dissimilar cultures are different and the same, how the human species has evolved over millions of years, and how individuals understand and operate successfully in distinct cultural settings. Anthropology includes five broad fields - cultural anthropology, linguistics, physical anthropology, archaeology and applied anthropology.

Anthropology contributes to a general liberal arts education, which helps students develop intellectually and personally, as well as professionally. Numerous studies indicate that a well- rounded education contributes to person's success in any chosen career, and because of its broad interdisciplinary nature, anthropology is especially suited to this purpose. In the context of liberal arts education, anthropology and anthropological research cultivate critical thinking skills. By being exposed to cultures and life styles of unfamiliar societies, students may adopt a more critical and analytical stance toward conditions in their own society. Further, anthropology creates an expanding global awareness and an appreciation of cultures other than our own.

The mission of Anthropology Program at Fatima Jinnah Women University is to advance the understanding of human diversity (human past and contemporary social life), employing specific theoretical and conceptual tools. This shared commitment is pursued through research and teaching drawing on a diverse array of humanistic and scientific approaches.

Employment Opportunities

Anthropology provides an excellent knowledge and skills required for students seeking employment with

a Bachelor's Degree in a wide variety of employment settings. Besides academics, cultural & natural resource management firms, technology companies (e.g. Microsoft, Intel, Samsung, Google etc.), public health, public administration, marketing, media organizations, museums and zoos, social services and vibrant opportunities in International & National NGOs, Development Agencies & research organizations are some of the many areas that have drawn on the training and experience of anthropology majors. Also, Anthropologists are hired as community experts in various construction projects such as irrigation and Dam building projects and other state institutions like WAPDA. Notably, the subject of Anthropology has been included in the Central Superior Service Pakistan (CSS competitive examination).

M. Phil Program Anthropology

The Department of Anthropology offers program of Master of Philosophy in Anthropology designed to provide a broad background in the field with a prime emphasis on sociocultural anthropology. It provides training both for students interested in academic career in Anthropology and for those who want to work as action researchers and professionals. The program in sociocultural anthropology offers opportunities to pursue a wide range of ethnographic and theoretical interests. Major focus of research include religion, politics, ethnicity, gender, problems of social change and development and media & educational landscapes. The program of study includes training in anthropological theory and methods, issues and problems in cultural anthropology as well topics that focus on the student's area of particular interest. This widened and intensive study of diversified fields of anthropology is expected to cater to the needs of not only aspiring anthropologists but also scholars from other fields wishing to expand their expertise through ethnographic lenses. Designed to inculcate the anthropological sensibility in attending students, the program includes a thorough study of the subject's classical and contemporary texts as well as practicums and discussions on key questions of methodological relevance. Through these options, students apply the social anthropological theories and methods learnt on the core modules to particular substantive themes and topics.

This program of advanced and intensive study enables students to creatively grapple with questions ranging from the nature of human society and the role of culture in shaping dispositions and behavior of citizens and subjects in contemporary world. The program aims to work with students to address issues critical to contemporary Pakistan including governance & development issues, public discourse, livelihoods, terrorism & intolerance, institutional development & accountability, Identity crisis and globalization to meet the demands and concerns of our country in order to make it a better place to live. All M.Phil students are required to undertake extensive fieldwork in order to write a dissertation that integrates anthropological perspectives in an original way.

The Department of English at Fatima Jinnah Women University is interdisciplinary in content and approach. It was established in 1998 and twelve sessions of Bachelors and twenty sessions of Masters have successfully earned their degrees and graduated. The initiation of the M.Phil. leading to Ph.D. English Program in 2007 was another milestone for the Department. Research papers, projects and theses focus on themes emerging from the various areas covered in the relevant courses and the contemporary literary and linguistic context of the country. In this pursuit, the department also organizes an annual conference as a regular feature of the department. The conference is titles as Annual National Conference on Linguistics, and Literature since 2019 focusing on emerging trends in literature and linguistics to ensure that the students get a chance to not only present their research work but also to form linkages with researchers and academicians.

The Department of English is resolute in its quest to always keep abreast with the contemporary developments in academic and research fields. The scheme of studies of the Department reflects its commitment to offering multicultural curricula. The current scheme of studies has many unique features which make it representative of the traditions and contemporary models in the study of English Language, Linguistics and Literature. The literature courses taught at MPhil/PhD level cover Literary Theory and Practice, Modern and Contemporary Poetry, and Post-Colonial Literature etc.; whereas the language and linguistics courses comprise Intercultural Pragmatics, Applied Linguistics, Contemporary Feminist Linguistic Theories etc.

A variety of courses are offered at the undergraduate level. Literature courses are based

on traditional as well as innovative and creative approaches. The students not only study the established areas such as classical and romantic poetry, classical drama, conventional novels and prose, but also contemporary literary masterpieces in novel and shorter fiction. Literature written in English around the world is also an important constituent of the scheme. Courses in American, Canadian, and Pakistani literature written in English are introduced to give the students an awareness of the current literary traditions around the world.

The language component at Undergraduate level includes courses related to General Linguistics, Applied Linguistics/ TEFL/TESL, Phonetics and Phonology, Morphology, Syntax, Grammar, Stylistics, Sociolinguistics, Psycholinguistics and Pragmatics. Offering such a wide range of language-related areas is an attempt to introduce the students to the current pedagogical and linguistic paradigms. Furthermore, summer semesters are utilized to enrich the knowledge and skills of students. Short, intensive courses offered in areas like Presentation. Writing and Reading Skills, Functional English. Creative Writing, etc. The knowledge and skills imparted in these areas also prepare the students for a resourceful out put in the job market. During the academic semesters, the students are required to make presentations, carry out projects, conduct academic research, participate in class discussions, and transcode from one medium to another. Thus, they are not only encouraged to think creatively and analytically but also to make them pursue viable professions as academia, journalists, content writers and teacher trainers.

Apart from curricular activities, our students are throughout encouraged to participate in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. They are motivated to venture in the areas of their interest. The department has a strong tradition of participating in declamations and debates, essay writing and story writing competitions, writing and reciting poetry, singing, writing and performing in plays at intra- and inter-university levels. The Department of Fine Arts at Fatima Jinnah Women University offers high quality art and design education to Undergraduate level. The department aspires to provide understanding of visual art that is socially and culturally rooted in Pakistan. The courses are based on theoretical foundation in conceptual thinking and extensive studio practice in visual literacy. The focus is to set up a creative center for women artists and designers to become independent practitioner. The arts and design practice follow three ideas: innovate, create, and execute.

Fine Arts Program at FJWU maintains a high quality of learning environment and is matched by the teaching and technical support available which ensures that all the students use their unique potential and earn a level of skill which is a support in their creativity. We are proud of the range of subjects offered in Art and Design. The Department presently offers 2 degree programs: Bachelors in Fine Arts and Bachelors in Design. Bachelors degree started in 2004. This program previously was a combination of Fine Arts and Design. In 2016 the department bifurcated bachelors in Fine Arts and Design. Both subject areas offer courses in studio practice and The foundation year will give an theory. understanding of all the specializations which are offered in the department. Gradually, at the advance level, a range of courses are integrated in the subject areas of Fine Arts and Design.

Fine Arts focus on hands on skills in drawing, sculpture, painting, printmaking and miniature painting, whereas, the Design degree familiarizes students with the basic design concepts, leading to use the technology to enhance their creative abilities in the fields like communication design, textiles, ceramics and photography.

Each artistic practice is rooted in the traditional form of expression which gradually moves to the contemporary art forms. Courses offered in painting furnish the skill to paint subjects in varied styles. The sculpture develops understanding of the third dimension in structure and ranges from figuration to abstraction and from formless to evidently identifiable forms. The use of different materials is taught as well. Miniature painting begins with the traditional form of miniature painting which includes an introduction to Mughal, Persian, Madhubani, Kangra, Pahari, and Rajput painting schools which were prevailing in the subcontinent. These traditional techniques serve as a base which allows students to experiment their own modern expressions. Printmaking is another important art practice taught in almost every school around the globe. The processes involved a basic familiarity of techniques and materials. The courses in monoprinting, intaglio, etching, mezzotint, woodcut, dry point, and collagraph are taught. Another important art practice taught to students is Islamic calligraphy offered to all students.

The discipline of design offers four specialized subject areas to students. These are communication design, textile & fashion Design ceramics, and photography. Communication design focuses on providing informed solutions to the design problems. The subject not only aims at identifying communication as an art discipline but also a field of inquiry. Communication design solves problems for a wide range of media by employing technology, creativity and visually apprized solutions. These areas will include but not limited to advertising, branding, identity design, corporate communication design, information design and book illustration. The photography at Fine Arts offers students the ability to explore, experience, and examine their surroundings. It harnesses their visual skills which carries them forward to be creative professionals. Photography enable students to creatively employ it in understanding their culture and society and create meanings. The courses are designed to gradually built knowledge of different genre of photography such as documentary, product, landscape, portraits and conceptual. In Ceramics, students not only create handmade ceramics but also use potter's wheel. The techniques and methods of glazing, firing, and smoking are taught. The students learn to make functional and non functional ceramics. In textile design, diverse skills are taught ranging from technique such as, tie and die, batik, silkscreen, weaving (off loom and on loom), screen printing, and how to create a design for any kind of textiles which includes Apparel, interior products and textiles art.

The Department of Fine Arts emphasizes on significance of the art history. Various courses in the eastern and western art ranging from the early period to the contemporary times are incorporated in the syllabus. The art practice is also furthered by encouraging analytic investigation of art forms thorough discussion and critique held in the classes. The aim of these discussions is to foster individual style and independent thought in the students. The courses aim at not only strengthening the conceptual framework of the research projects but also producing informed, creative, and competitive individuals.



Bioinformatics is the study of DNA, genes, and medications, using statistics, programming, and tools. It is a combination of biology, computer science, and information technology. It is an emerging interdisciplinary research area where the ultimate goal is to explore the treasure of biological information hidden in the mass of sequence, structure, literature, and other biological data to get a better understanding of the life and life-forming units. This information can be further used to enhance the standard of life for mankind.

The purpose of offering this program is to inculate biological data analysis skills in our students as currently biomedical sciences have become more data-driven and bioinformatics is pivotal to all these areas. Bioinformaticians use computer technologies to extract information from biological records. They work in the field of computational genomics, sequencing of the human genome, drug therapeutics, and translational research. Research and development are incomplete nowadays without the involvement of bioinformatics tools. The science of Bioinformatics is essential to the use of genomic information in understanding human diseases and in the identification of new molecular targets for drug discovery.

Clinical practices, personalized medicine, agriculture, and forensic science all have a high demand for bioinformaticians. Bioinformatics has many uses in the bioenergy, veterinary research, and biotechnology manufacturing sectors. Bioinformatics graduates are required by a variety of pharmaceutical firms, healthcare organizations, biotech companies, and educational institutions. The Department of Law was established at FJWU in 2015, with an ambition to provide an intellectually dynamic and diverse environment for elevating the ethical and educational standards of legal education, to produce legal professionals- particularly women- to serve the legal profession, and to provide law graduates capable of taking responsibilities at various fora. It aims to instill ethical and professional values in the students and to produce responsible citizens and law professionals.

Vision

To achieve the highest standards of professional competence in the practice of law through well-versed academic, critical, and ethical excellence and seeking a challenging interdisciplinary exposure to law and legal research.

Mission

The mission of the Department of Law is to inculcate a sense of balance and accommodation which is essentially required for upholding and advocating the cause of justice across the entire spectrum of societal as well as professional dispensation. The department's educational endeavor is geared towards preparing legal professionals who are not only well acquainted with the basics of the legal discipline, ethical excellence, and critical and analytical skills but are also adequately equipped with legal research abilities.

5-year Undergraduate Program

Department of Law offers a 5-year LLB degree program. This program aims to expose students to a wide range of disciplinary approaches to legal study and also emphasizes upon the variety of ways of understanding law's role in contemporary society. The bachelor program focuses on basic principles of law along with their jurisprudential rationale, civil and criminal law jurisdictions, and the national and international perspective of laws. Substantive and procedural laws and their effective application in solving legal issues are being taught, for which moot court competitions are held to sharpen the students' legal skills. Furthermore, the teaching methodology encompasses a critical, comparative approach in order to broaden their analytical perspectives.

In addition to the knowledge of core law subjects, a variety of general and foundation courses as per HEC's curriculum expose the students to diversify their learning environment. As a result, Law students have actively participated in national and international moot court competitions. To ingrain litigation skills, understand the procedural processes, and get knowledge about court proceedings, a ten-week mandatory internship (3 credit hours) after the eighth semester is also offered, in which students are placed in different law firms and offices to have firsthand

knowledge of litigation and court's procedures before the completion of their degree. It is also mandatory to undertake community work to develop a sense of social responsibility in students. Furthermore, students are also required to undertake research pertaining to any legal issue in their last semester, in order to suggest viable solutions and appropriate recommendations to the lawmakers. Upon the accomplishment of a degree, our law students are able to contribute to the national development process by participating in the fields of academia, legal industry, legal research, civil bureaucracy, judiciary, private sector, and policymaking bodies.

M. Phil Program

M. Phil in Public Management at FJWU offers an

opportunity to explore some of the key public management issues of the 21st century. This includes an examination of the nature and problems of Public Management in the contemporary world; how in a globalized world public decision-making can be constructed in a way that delivers legitimacy and effective capacity to act; and the impact of governance arrangements on policy outcomes and the relationship between the state and citizens. Undergraduate Program

BS Educational Leadership and Management (4 years)

The Bachelor of Science program in Educational Leadership and Management is specially geared toward learners, who aspire to or serve as educational managers and administrators in public and private sector educational institutions and would like to advance their educational career as future educational leaders. This rigorous program is designed to provide students access to both theoretical underpinnings and practical field-based experiential learning opportunities for their holistic development. The courses offered in the program broadly span across theories of leadership, and management, critical analyses of education policies and plans, personal and professional development as an educational leader, development and administration of educational organizations, and sustainable development of the education sector.

B.Ed (Hons) Early Childhood Care and Education (4 Years) Program

The urgent need for the development of a robust B.Ed (Hons) Early Childhood Care and Education (4 Years) program in private and public institutions has been reiterated in several national and international documents. Because the early years of a child's life are a strong base for lifelong learning and cognitive and social development. In response to the urgent need, Education Department has designed the Early Childhood Care & Education (ECCE) program to

prepare the graduates to become gualified Early Childhood Care and Education practitioner who may contribute to the well-being of children, families, and their community. The program integrates theoretical learning with practicum experience to equip ECCE graduates with knowledge and skills to work with children from zero to eight years of age. Theoretical and practical learning activities of the program will prepare the graduates to work with ECCE children for their holistic physical, social, emotional, moral, and cognitive development. It will prepare the graduates to become qualified ECCE practitioners who may contribute to the well-being of children, families, and their communities. It will also help the graduates to develop an understanding of how toddlers learn the skills they need for life.

B. Ed (Hons.) Elementary

The program is an accredited four-year degree program that spreads over eight semesters and comprises 134 credit hours. The program focuses on nurturing those aspects among aspiring teachers that correspond to the basic requirements of National Education Policy 2017, National Scheme of Studies 2006, National Professional Teaching Standards 2008, and National Accreditation Council for Teacher Education 2009. The program is unique as it exhibits a divergence from an over-reliance on a teacher-centered lecture method to learner-centered and active learning approaches that encourage the development of requisite skills and dispositions for teaching. Furthermore, the

program focuses on contemporary pedagogical techniques, adequate knowledge of the subject matter, effective instructional and teaching communication skills, critical thinking, and creative teaching skills.

Postgraduate Programs

B.Ed (1.5 years)

B.Ed (1.5 years) is a program specifically designed to prepare females with Master's degrees in any subject who aspire to join the teaching profession. The program is spread over three semesters and comprises 54 credit hours. The scheme includes general education and advanced pedagogical courses to prepare females to teach at secondary and higher secondary levels.

M.Phil. in Education

M.Phil in Education Program is spread over four semesters, including 24 credit hours of coursework and 6 credit hours of a research thesis. It is designed to provide graduates in Education with a broad and critical awareness of educational theory, practice, and policy. The program aims to produce high-quality educational thinkers, experts, and researchers in order to generate and apply knowledge. It also focuses on providing intellectual leadership to people engaged in teaching, management, and research activities and improving the potential of future scholars for interacting effectively among the international community of educators.

Ph.D. in Education

Doctor of Philosophy in Education is a research degree program designed for individuals seeking to be researchers in the field of Education. This program prepares Ph.D. students to discover new knowledge through basic research and answer specific questions about practical problems through applied research. The main purpose is to prepare a substantial piece of original research, designed to be completed within three years of study including coursework as well. The final award of the degree is decided solely on the results of the candidate's research presented in the Ph.D. dissertation and on the candidate's performance in the oral examination.

Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) is a part of FJWU's vision for maintaining and improving the quality of service delivery, in order to live up to the expectations of the stakeholders; including students, teachers, parents, employers and, above all, the nation. The QEC was established at FJWU in July 2007 and since then quality related issues are being increasingly routed through this conduit, while simultaneously ensuring incremental, consistent, and sustainable expansion of the related measures. The Cell itself is part of the landmark initiative of Quality Assurance Agency (QAA) of the Higher Education Commission (HEC) of Pakistan. With regular intervals, the QAA arranges meetings in different cities for the QEC personnel from all over Pakistan to share their vision and professional acumen. Entry to the international higher education quality management club is conditional to regular annual subscriptions. Sizeable investment is made by FJWU under this head, as its QEC is a member of Asia Pacific Quality Network (APQN) and International Network for Quality Assurance Agencies in Higher Education (INQAAHE). The Cell also organizes workshops and seminars at FJWU, invites the QA professionals and academics from sister universities for deliberating on common quality related issues.

Quality Assurance (QA) Policy of the University

Administration

Registrar Office

The Registrar's Office plays an important part in building, regulating, and governing the University under the direct supervision of the Vice Chancellor. It helps in interpreting the rules and regulations of the university and their proper implementation for streamlining the functions of the university. The Office of the Registrar is principally engaged to serve the faculty and students of the university with the key principle of maintaining the confidentiality of the official as well as personal records of the faculty, staff, and students. It provides support for the academic as well as administrative activities/functions of the university. It extends support for recruitment, placement, and capacity building of the faculty and administrative staff of the university. It also keeps a comprehensive record of the new entrants as well as alumni.

The registrar also serves as the Secretary of the Statutory Bodies of the university such as the Syndicate, Selection Board, Academic Council, and Advanced Studies Research Board. It represents the university on various international and National forums and coordinates with foreign and local universities and thinks tanks for collaborative research projects and joint ventures. It also provides the services of a liaison office for international students.

Admission Office

The admission office provides a central service to the public for information and management of admission procedures for applicants desirous of getting enrolled in Undergraduate and Post Graduate Programmes of the university. All admissions to every department are processed strictly on merit.

The Office disseminates information on entry criteria and admission formalities through advertisement in print-media and FJWU website for the public. It maintains the data of applicants and enrolled students. This office remains the first point of contact for potential prospective students until their enrollments in the university. It also deals with specific students' affairs such as semester break and clearance after the

completion of studies.

Student Financial Aid Office (SFAO)

Student Financial Aid Office (SFAO) looks into and manages the administration of Merit and Need Based Scholarships. It identifies the available resources, and evaluates the students' eligibility for scholarships available, depending on needs-analysis. It also liaisons with the donor agencies and forwards them the recommendations of university for the allocation of specific scholarships. FJWU enjoys the supports of national and International donors like Punjab Educational Endowment Fund (PEEF), Diya, Mitsubishi, USAID, HEC, Bait-UI-Mal, Ministry of Religious Affairs (MORA), Civil Society Human and Institutional Development Program (CHIP), EHSAAS Undergraduate Scholarship Program etc. SFAO continuously endeavors to find donors for more scholarships. The university even supports some students out of its own resources.

Students in need of financial support respond to related advertisement which appear soon after the commencement to the fresh session. The SFAO guides these students to scholarship programs according to their needs, eligibility, and suitability of the said program.

Courses Coordinatior Office (CCO)

The interviews, contracts of visiting faculty members and their payment bills are prepared in this office. Experience Certificates of the visiting faculty members are issued from this office. CCO also coordinates with all departments for the issuance of University Identity Cards to the students and visiting faculty members.

It liaisons with respective Faculty Dean for the administration and management of courses offered in Postgraduate and Undergraduate Programs. CCO also coordinates the management of various facilities and resources for faculty members.

Admin Office (Academics)

The contracts of full time faculty and staff, visiting faculty, thesis supervisors and their

payment bills are prepared in this office, Different office orders and notices are also issued by this office.

Record of earned and casual leaves, personal files and service books are also maintained and updated in admin office

Admin Office (Admin)

The Admin Office (Admin) performs following tasks:

- a) It organizes interviews for hiring of employees from BPS-1 to BPS-16. Performance evaluation and facilitation in renewal of their contracts is also done by this office. It issues office orders and notices regarding matters pertaining to different employees and maintains Service Books of permanent employees of FJWU.
- b) It provides the logistic support in organizing different events of the university along with the arrangement of refreshments.
- c) It liaisons with all the departments in the university.
- d) It deals with the university cafeteria shops, university quarters, security and purchases.
- e) It allocates duties of drivers, naib qasids and sanitary workers.
- f) It circulates notices and helps in issuance of furniture and stationery.
- g) It is responsible for the publication of Tender Notices and Advertisements of the university.
- h) It maintains the record of photographs and CDs of different events.
- I) It keeps a check over the cleanliness of university premisses.

Accounts Office

The Accounts Office is responsible for managing the property, the finances, and the investments of university funds. Accounts Office comprises Establishment/Payroll Section, Development Expenditure Section, Recurring Expenditure Section, Fee Section, and Audit Liaison Section and it is headed by the Treasurer/Chief Financial Officer.

The detailed working of the office is as follows;

 Prepares the annual and revised budget estimates of the university and presents them to the Finance & Planning Committee and the Syndicate for approval.

- Process payments from different approved budget heads after completing all the codal and financial formalities.
- Ensures that the funds of the university are expended for the purposes they are provided.
- Prepares consolidated annual statements of the accounts.
- Verification of the fee deposits and maintenance of the financial data and records. Reimbursement/Refund of various fee/security claims.
- Preparation and disbursement of payroll of all the employees.
- Disbursement of various scholarships to regular students i.e. (Punjab Educational Endowment Fund (PEEF), HEC Need-Based and Merit scholarships, Japanese Need-Based Scholarships, University Need-Based Scholarships, Ministry of Religious Affairs (MORA) Scholarships, United States Aid for International Development (USAID) Scholarships, DIYA Scholarships, Bait-ul-Mall Scholarships, Civil Society Human and Institutional Development (CHIP) Scholarships, Mitsubishi Scholarships, EHSAS Undergraduate Scholarships and other scholarships from various donors /organizations.
- To deduct the withholding taxes as per government rules and deposit the same in the Government Treasury.
- Getting the accounts audited by the Auditor General Audit Punjab annually.
- Representing the university at various forums.

Examination Office

The objective of the Examination Office is to execute high quality and legally secure system in addition to offering services for students, instructors, and administrators related to exams.

The examination office ensures the administration of the University Grading System, students' academic status, their appeals (if any) regarding results, the printing of academic transcripts and degrees for graduating students, medals for students with distinction, and holding of annual convocation.

The Office of Research, Innovation and Commercialization (ORIC)

Office of Research, Innovation and Commercialization (ORIC) aims to provide strategic and operational support to the university research, commercialization and entrepreneurship development activities. Established in the year 2012, ORIC has been successful in creating awareness about well-informed culture that is linked to research, entrepreneurship and socio-economic priorities of FJWU and its broader community.

To fulfill its purpose, ORIC provides support in identification of funding opportunities, capacity building of faculty, staff and students through various training programs, enterprise development, industry liaison, and commercialization of existing facilities and resources. So far ORIC has supported 26 research projects. In the year 2019 project funding has increased to Rs. 48.00 millions/-.

The university has filed 2 patents, out of which one was granted in the field of Environmental Chemistry. ORIC facilitates and helps departments to connect to different national and international organizations/institutions. Thus far, ORIC has established collaborative linkages with 48 national and 45 international partners.

ORIC has already established Fatima Jinnah Women Entrepreneurship Development Centre (FJWEDC). This facility is sponsored by Direct Aid Program (DAP) of the Australian High Commission, Islamabad.

The center has well equipped incubation center, which helps female students and faculty to develop their entrepreneurial capacities, access to legal and technical resources, connect to mentors and use co-working space to convert their business ideas into sustainable businesses. The center has incubated seven startups, out of which 4 have graduated. Some of the incubate companies have won seed funding amounting to Rs. 0.5 million. In addition,

to create entrepreneurial culture within the university, trainings on developing entrepreneurial skills among students and faculty have been arranged and thus, more than 500 potential entrepreneurs have been trained. This program is supported by local, national and international partners, intellectuals, development experts, chambers and local community. Furthermore, entrepreneurial courses at undergraduate levels are being offered by different departments under the guidance of the center. To make it more sustainable, Youth Entrepreneurial Society (YES) and FJWU-RCCI Youth Club have been established recently. These student led societies aim to create the next generation leaders through an open platform for educational training, professional guidance, and Iona-term mentorina.

FJWU is in process of establishing a Center for Learning Excellence; the center will initially be supervised and guided by FJWU ORIC. The mandate of this center will be to build capacities of faculty and staff of the University as well as targeting different universities of the country. This mandate is further extended to industries and communities for developing their capacities and competencies to overcome problems through research and training. This mandate will be covered by two sections of the center:

- 1. Executive Development Unit
- 2. Faculty Development Unit

Transport Office

FJWU provides accessible, comfortable, secure, economical, and reliable transportation facility to staff and students to and from the designated bus stops. The university has its own buses, coasters, and vans that cover most parts of the twin cities; GT Road upto Gujjar Khan, and Peshawar Road upto Wah Cantt. These vehicles depart once a day on weekdays from pickup spots on all routes. FJWU charges nominal transport fee/amount for this service.

Infrastructure Development Programs

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DIRECTORATE

INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT WORKS

The Directorate of Planning and Development is the backbone of an organization, which plays a fundamental and vital role in its growth and development. The Directorate of Planning & Development works under the supervision, guidance, and leadership of the Vice Chancellor. The role of this department is to assess the current and future needs for physical and academic infrastructure and prepare plans accordingly. All development projects are prepared by this Directorate and submitted to HEC, Punjab Government, and different forums. The Directorate is headed by Director (P&D).

Following is a brief description of the projects currently under execution.

I. Campus-II (located at Chakri Road, Rawalpindi)

The university is in the process of establishing its Campus-II at Chakri Road Rawalpindi, at a distance of 16 km from the City Campus. A residential campus spread over about 2,333 kanals of land with over 6 million square feet of covered area has been planned to cater to the requirements of over 25,000 students. The current status of development at Campus II is as under:

a) Completed projects:

- Boundary wall has been completed.
- Under PC-1 "Development of FJWU Campus-II, Phase-1", approved External Development Works including the construction of 10 x roads, overhead water tank, site security office, and fixing of main entrance gate have been completed. PC-IV for this project has been submitted to HEC.

b) Projects under construction:

Under PC-1 "Development of FJWU Campus-II, Phase-2", 2 x Academic Blocks to accommodate 6 academic departments and 1 x girl's hostel are nearing completion. 96% of the work has been completed for these three buildings. External Development Works under this PC-1 have been completed.

II. City Campus (located at The Mall, Rawalpindi); Recent Initiatives

Business Incubation Center (BIC): Youth Development Office and Women Development Center in collaboration with the Ministry of Human Rights Government of Pakistan have established the Business Incubation Center (BIC) situated in the basement of Girls Hostel Wing III. This project was led by Ms. Sumera Khalid, A/Xen (Civil), and has successfully been completed.


